## Your Verse

## Devotional: Embracing True Freedom in Jesus

**Freedom from sin's power** is the foundation of your new life in Christ. When Jesus died and rose again, He broke the chains that held you captive to wrongdoing and guilt. This freedom is not just about avoiding sin but about being truly set free from sin's grip and its consequences.

As a teen, it's easy to feel trapped by past mistakes, shame, or the pressure to be perfect. But Romans 6:6-7 reminds us that when Jesus died, your 'old self'—the part enslaved to sin—was crucified too, freeing you from slavery to sin. This means you don't have to live under guilt or defeat anymore.

*John 8:36* declares a powerful truth: "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed!" This freedom goes beyond what the world offers; it's liberation deep in your heart and soul. God invites you to stand firm, as Galatians 5:1 encourages, and not fall back into old habits or legalistic rules but live boldly as someone made new.

Today, reflect on the truth that you are no longer a slave to sin. You have been freed by Jesus' love and power. Let this truth sink deep and start to shape how you think and live.



## Reflect and Apply

1. What areas of your life feel like chains or bondage to sin?

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2. How does knowing Jesus has set you free change how you view your past mistakes?

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3. Why is it important to stand firm and not be burdened by slavery again?

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## Journaling Prompts

1. Write about a time when you felt trapped by sin and how Jesus' freedom speaks to that.

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2. List ways you can remind yourself daily that you are no longer a slave to sin.

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3. Describe what freedom in Christ means personally for your future.

## Day 2: 💖 Freedom from Legalism: Grace, Not Rules



## Your Verse

*Ephesians 2:8-9 - "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast."*

## Supporting Scriptures

- *Galatians 2:21 - "I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!"*
- *Romans 3:28 - "For we maintain that a person is justified by faith apart from the works of the law."*



## Devotional: Living Under Grace, Not Law

Freedom in Christ also means freedom from legalism—the idea that you must earn God’s love and acceptance by following a checklist of rules perfectly. But Ephesians 2:8–9 reminds us that **salvation is a gift**, given by God’s grace and received through faith. It’s not about what you do; it’s about what Jesus has already done for you.

*Legalism* can make serving God feel like a burden, as if you must earn His favor each day. But when you live under grace, you realize that God’s love does not depend on your performance but on His unchanging character and the sacrifice of Jesus. Galatians 2:21 warns us that trying to gain righteousness by law rejects grace and undermines Christ’s sacrifice.

Romans 3:28 reinforces that justification—the state of being made right with God—comes through faith alone, not by works. This means you don’t have to prove yourself by trying harder or being perfect. Instead, you’re free to serve God out of gratitude and love, not obligation or fear.

Today, reflect on whether legalistic thinking has made you feel weighed down. Thank God for His grace and allow it to inspire joyful living and genuine service.



## Reflect and Apply

1. Do you ever feel pressure to earn God's love by your actions? How does that affect you?

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2. How can embracing grace change your motivation to serve God?

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3. What difference does it make to know that salvation is a gift, not a reward?

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## Journaling Prompts

1. Write about a time when you felt burdened by trying to 'earn' God's love.

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2. List ways you can remind yourself daily that grace, not works, saves you.

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3. Describe how serving God can look different when motivated by grace.

# Devotional: Joyful Service Through Spirit-Led Freedom

The freedom Jesus gives is not a license to live selfishly but an invitation to serve God and others through the power of the Holy Spirit. 2 Corinthians 3:17 reveals that where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is true freedom—freedom to live authentically, love unconditionally, and serve joyfully.

Galatians 5:13 reminds you not to misuse freedom to follow selfish desires but to choose humble service motivated by love. This is the heart of living under grace: you serve not out of pressure or guilt, but because you love God and want to reflect His character.

The psalmist captures the spirit of this service perfectly, encouraging us to worship with gladness and come before God with joyful songs. Serving God becomes a delight, an expression of freedom and gratitude rather than an obligation.

As a teen, you have the incredible opportunity to live a life marked by Spirit-led freedom. Embrace this joy and let it propel you to shine God's light in your world.
