Your Verse

John 14:27 - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:6 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Day 1: Recognizing God's Peace Over Fear

Devotional: Embracing God's Peace Amid Fear and OCD

Fear and anxiety can feel overwhelming, especially when intertwined with compulsive thoughts about sin and judgment. But Jesus offers us a peace that the world cannot give—a peace that calms the heart and silences fear.

When you find yourself trapped in obsessive worries about sinning or God's displeasure, remember Jesus' words in John 14:27. He is directly addressing fearful hearts, assuring them of a peace that surpasses human understanding.

This peace is not dependent on your perfection but on His perfect love. OCD may try to convince you that your thoughts define you, but God's Spirit points to your true identity: beloved, accepted, and covered by grace.

Through prayer and intentionally seeking God's presence, you can invite His peace to replace fear. Today, focus on letting God's peace permeate your mind and spirit, even amid intrusive thoughts.

2.	List scriptures or prayers that bring you comfort when fear arises.
3.	Describe what it feels like when God's peace enters your heart.

Prayer for Today

Dear Lord, thank You for the promise of Your peace that calms troubled hearts and quiets fear. Help me to lean on Your steadfast love rather than my anxious thoughts. Teach me to seek Your presence faithfully, especially when OCD and fear try to overwhelm me. Let Your peace guard my mind and soul, reminding me that I am secure in You.

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."
- Psalm 103:12 "As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us."







Devotional: Resting in the Power of God's Grace

Living with OCD and a fear of sinning often means feeling trapped in cycles of guilt and self-condemnation. Yet Scripture declares a freeing truth—there is no condemnation for those who belong to Christ.

The fear that you are separated from God due to past or present thoughts is a lie that OCD magnifies. God's grace, however, reaches deeper than any guilt or shame you carry.

Romans 8:1 reminds us we are covered wholly by the righteousness of Christ, not by our imperfect actions or intrusive thoughts. When you truly internalize this, the chains of fear and obsession begin to loosen.

God's grace is not cheap or weak; it is powerful and made perfect in our weakness. Today, open your heart to receive that grace fully and reject the lies of guilt that fuel your fear.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What areas of your life do you struggle to believe God's grace covers?
2.	How does the truth of no condemnation challenge OCD-driven guilt?
3.	In what ways can you remind yourself daily of God's sufficient grace?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about how guilt or condemnation has affected your faith walk.
2.	List ways God's grace has shown up in your life despite your fears.
3.	Create a prayer of surrender, releasing your guilt into God's hands.







Prayer for Today

Father God, thank You that Your grace is greater than my guilt and weakness. Help me to accept that in Christ, I am no longer condemned. Teach me to rest in Your love and to let go of fears that accuse me unjustly. Strengthen me in moments of weakness and remind me that Your power is made perfect there.

Supporting Scriptures

Devotional: Taking Thoughts Captive to Christ's Authority

OCD often bombards the mind with false accusations and fears, making it difficult to rest in God's truth. But Paul gives us a powerful strategy: take every thought captive and make it obedient to Christ.

This means actively challenging obsessive thoughts by aligning them with God's Word—truth, not fear, becomes the foundation of your mind.

Renewing your mind takes intentional effort and prayer, but it reclaims your freedom in Christ. When worry or fear about sin creeping in, turn to Scripture, remind yourself of your identity, and refuse to entertain lies.

Today, commit to fighting unhealthy thoughts with God's truth and embrace the transformation He desires in your heart and mind.

1.	Which obsessive thoughts challenge your understanding of God's truth?
2.	How can taking captive your thoughts help you find freedom from OCD?
3.	What practical steps will you take to renew your mind daily?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Record recurring thoughts that feel destructive or untrue.
2.	Write down Scripture verses that counter those thoughts.
3.	Describe how you can remind yourself of God's truth when anxiety rises.







Prayer for Today

Lord Jesus, *help me to take every thought captive and make it obedient to You.* Fill my mind with Your truth and transform my thinking. When fear and doubt try to creep in, remind me of Your Word and Your love. Strengthen me to overcome lies and rest in Your authority.

Day 4: Bestoring the Soul Through God's Spirit

Devotional: Finding Soul Restoration and Rest in Jesus

OCD and fear of sinning can leave your soul weary and burdened, longing for rest. The Psalmist offers beautiful reassurance that God is the restorer of our souls, guiding us gently along righteous paths.
