From Deserted to Delighted: Women Embracing God's Joy



Journey through seven days exploring how women experience God's joy after deep loss, transforming desertion into delight.





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Introduction

Welcome to this transformative 7-day Bible study plan focused on women who have experienced deep loss and long for the joy promised by God. Life's deserts can feel barren and lonely, and for many women, loss—whether through grief, disappointment, or abandonment—can leave the soul feeling utterly deserted. Yet the Bible offers hope, healing, and an invitation to rediscover joy that surpasses circumstance.

Throughout this study, you will engage with stories of women in Scripture who walked through loss yet found God's sustaining presence and overflowing joy. You will explore verses that reveal God's faithful character and His desire to restore, renew, and delight in those who trust Him. Each day combines Scripture, reflection, and prayer to help you move from feelings of desertion to the heartfelt delight found only in God.

As you journey forward, remember: God's joy is not dependent on external conditions but is a gift available even in the most challenging seasons. May these days inspire you with hope, deepen your faith, and remind you that you are dearly loved by a God who delights in you.

Psalm 30:5 - "Weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning."

- Lamentations 3:22–23 "Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning..."







Devotional: Embracing God's Promise of Joyful Mornings

Loss often feels like an endless night of weeping, but God promises a morning filled with joy. In Psalm 30:5, David acknowledges sorrow but declares the certainty of rejoicing. For women who have endured deep deserts—whether through loss of relationship, dreams, or hope—this verse is a beacon of hope.

Isaiah 61 paints a picture of God's restoration: ashes turned into beauty and mourning transformed into joy. This change is not superficial but a deep, soul-renewing joy that God desires to give. Lamentations reminds us of God's unending mercy, renewed every day, inviting us to trust Him each morning.

Today, embrace God's promise of new beginnings. Though the pain may linger, His joy awaits you beyond the night.

Day 2:
Hope in the Midst of Desertion

Devotional: Trusting God's Hopeful Plans

Desertion can feel like abandonment, yet God assures us He is actively working for our good. Isaiah 43 encourages us to release the grip on past pain and open our eyes to the new things God is doing. This requires faith and surrender, especially after deep losses.

Jeremiah offers another anchor: God has plans filled with hope and purpose. Even if our current feelings suggest otherwise, God's intentions for us remain good. Romans 8:28 further reassures that every situation—even painful ones —are woven into God's redemptive plan.

Today, hold onto this hope and allow God to breathe new life into your story. His hands are shaping a future filled with delight, even if the road feels uncertain.

Your Verse

John 16:20 - "You will weep and mourn... but your grief will turn to joy."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 126:5 "Those who sow with tears will reap with songs of joy."
- 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 "God comforts us in all our troubles... so that we can comfort others."







Devotional: From Tears to Songs of Joy

Jesus' words in John 16 affirm that grief is real but temporary, and joy will follow. The process of mourning is necessary but not permanent. Psalm 126 reminds us that tears sow the seeds of future joy—sometimes the hardest seasons produce the richest harvest of delight.

Moreover, the comfort God provides in our pain is not only for ourselves but enables us to support and encourage others in their struggles. Our journey from desertion to delight becomes a testimony of God's faithfulness and grace.

Embrace the journey today, allowing God to turn your mourning into joy and prepare you to be a source of comfort for others.

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 – "My grace is sufficient... for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 34:18 "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."
- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







Devotional: God's Power Perfected Through Weakness

God's strength shines brightest in our brokenness. Paul's confession in 2 Corinthians reveals that limitations and weaknesses are opportunities for God's grace and power to be displayed. For women recovering from loss, recognizing vulnerability as a gateway to divine strength is powerful.

The Psalmist comforts us by assuring God's nearness to the brokenhearted. When spirit feels crushed, God's rescue is near. Isaiah encourages the weary by offering renewed strength that sustains day after day.

Today, instead of hiding your weaknesses, bring them before God and receive His empowering grace to walk from desertion into delight.

Joel 2:25 - "I will repay you for the years the locusts have eaten..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- Revelation 21:4 "He will wipe every tear from their eyes... no more death or mourning..."







Devotional: God's Promise to Restore All Loss

God promises restoration and repayment for losses endured. Joel's assurance of repaying years lost to devastation is a powerful declaration of divine restoration. For women who feel their time or dreams were stolen, God's promise reignites hope.

Psalm 147 offers comfort that God heals broken hearts and binds wounds — an ongoing process of renewal. Revelation paints a picture of ultimate restoration where sorrow ceases forever. Until then, God's healing is a present reality and a future hope.

Allow God to redeem your past and restore your joy. Trust in His timing and faithfulness to bring delight from desertion.

2.	How does God's healing bring comfort to your heart?
3.	What hope does the promise of eternal restoration give you today?

Day 6: 🛠 Delight in God's Presence

Devotional: Finding Joy in God's Nearness

True delight is found in God's presence. Psalm 16 celebrates the profound joy that comes when we walk closely with God. This joy is not fleeting but full and sustaining. Women recovering from loss can find solace by seeking God's presence daily.

Zephaniah reveals a tender God who rejoices and sings over His people, illustrating the depth of His delight in us. Nehemiah encourages believers to find strength in the joy that only the Lord provides.

Today, choose to focus on God's presence as your source of delight and strength. Let His joy fill your heart, replacing desertion with gladness.

Devotional: Choosing Joy as Daily Strength

Joy is not just a feeling but a spiritual strength to live fully. Nehemiah's call encourages us not to grieve endlessly but to find strength in the joy that comes from the Lord. This kind of joy empowers women to move beyond loss toward new life.

Paul's exhortation in Philippians to rejoice always reminds us joy is a choice rooted in our relationship with Christ. The fruit of the Spirit listed in Galatians shows joy as a natural outcome of walking in step with the Holy Spirit.

As you conclude this study, commit to living delighted in God's joy—embracing it daily as your strength and testimony.
