#### Devotional: Recognizing Your Strength as a Veteran

To be a veteran, whether in a literal or spiritual sense, is to have endured challenges with resilience and perseverance. The "soldier mindset" is one of readiness, discipline, and alertness—a powerful strength essential during battles. But even the strongest warriors face seasons of weariness.

#### Your Verse

Matthew 11:28 NIV - "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Ecclesiastes 4:6 NIV "Better one handful with tranquillity than two handfuls with toil and chasing after the wind."
- Hebrews 4:9–10 NIV "There remains, then, a Sabbath–rest for the people of God; for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their own work, just as God did from his."







Day 2: 💥 The Burden of Constant Readiness

#### Devotional: Releasing the Weight of Readiness

The soldier mindset often breeds a constant state of vigilance—ready for the next challenge, the next fight, the next call to arms. While such readiness is essential in combat, it can become a heavy burden, leading to exhaustion and spiritual dryness.

Jesus invites those who are "weary and burdened" to come to Him for rest. This invitation is radical for those accustomed to never lowering their defenses. It calls for a conscious release of the tension that comes from always being "on."

Ecclesiastes reminds us that striving without rest leads to chasing the wind—efforts that leave us empty. God's design includes times of rest and restoration, modeled in His own work pattern and guaranteed through the promise of His Sabbath rest.

Consider today what burdens you carry in your constant readiness, and bring them gently to Jesus, who longs to refresh your soul.

# Devotional: Embracing Our Identity as Beloved Children

The defining shift from soldier to son is a profound change in relational identity. As soldiers, we may feel compelled by duty and obligation. As sons and daughters, we rest in the love and acceptance of our Father.

Romans 8:15 reminds us that the Spirit we have received does not bind us to fear or slavery but adopts us into God's family. The tender cry of "Abba, Father" reveals an intimate relationship marked by love, freedom, and security.

- John 15:9 NIV "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love."







#### Devotional: Finding Soul Rest Through Divine Love

Rest for the soul is found when we anchor ourselves in God's unchanging love and protection. The psalmist declares a profound confidence—God is a rock, a fortress, immovable and trustworthy. This assurance allows the soul to rest fully, without fear or anxiety.

Jesus echoes this message in Matthew, urging us not to worry about life's demands because God cares deeply for us. His love is our refuge—it frees us from the relentless drive to be always prepared by inviting us to simply remain in His love.

As you meditate on these truths today, visualize yourself resting in the secure place of God's love where worry fades and strength is restored. This rest is not idleness but a vibrant peace that empowers your next steps.

Allow God's love to be your safe fortress and refuge.

2.	What fears or worries do I need to release today?
3.	How can I cultivate daily habits that help me 'remain' in God's love?

Day 5: Daying Down the Armor

#### Your Verse

Ephesians 6:10–11 NIV – "Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God..." (focus on the resting trust behind the armor)

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Zechariah 4:6 NIV "Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit," says the Lord Almighty.
- 1 Peter 5:7 NIV "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you."







Day 5: Daying Down the Armor

#### Devotional: Trusting God Beyond the Armor

Though believers are called to put on God's armor for spiritual battles, the believer is also invited to rest behind that armor, trusting in God's Spirit rather than their own might.

Ephesians exhorts us to be strong in the Lord's power. But Zechariah reminds us strength comes not by human effort. There is an inherent tension between readiness and rest, between the armor's protection and the peace found in trusting God's Spirit to fight on our behalf.

Many veterans carry the metaphorical armor long after the battle ends, holding tightly to control and preparedness. God calls us instead to *lay down* burdened vigilance and to cast our anxieties upon Him who cares deeply.

Today, consider where you might continue to cling to self-reliance and how God's Spirit invites you into peaceful trust.

Heavenly Father, I admit my tendency to lean on my own strength and to hold tightly to my armor. Help me to be strong in Your power and to trust Your Spirit to fight for me. #### **Supporting Scriptures**

- John 8:36 NIV "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."
- Psalm 46:10 NIV "Be still, and know that I am God..."







Day 6: A Living in Freedom and Rest

#### Devotional: Standing Firm in Christ's Freedom

Freedom is the promise and destiny of every believer, a freedom that encompasses rest, peace, and release from old yokes. For veterans entrenched in a soldier mindset, freedom can feel elusive when the habit of constant vigilance feels like safety.

Galatians encourages us to stand firm and reject the burdens that enslave us. Jesus declares that true freedom comes only through Him. But freedom requires rest—a letting go—not only of external chains but internal ones too.

Psalm 46:10 calls us to be still and recognize God's sovereignty. In that stillness, freedom is confirmed. Choosing to live freely in Christ means trusting God more than our own defenses, opening ourselves to His peace.

Today, consider the freedom Christ offers and what it means to live unburdened and at rest.

#### Devotional: Embracing Peace in Our New Identity

Philippians encourages us to replace anxiety with prayer and thanksgiving, promising God's peace that guards our hearts. This peace is the hallmark of sonship, a daily reminder that we are cared for tenderly.

Colossians exhorts us to approach all tasks wholeheartedly, not out of obligation but as service to our Father—knowing our labor has eternal reward. The image of the shepherd in Psalm 23 assures us of constant care and restoration.

Walking beyond the soldier mindset is a daily journey of choosing rest, love, and purposeful living in God's presence.
