Day 1: O Leading with Godly Purpose

Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 37:5 "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this."
- James 1:5 "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God... and it will be given to you."







Day 1: (§) Leading with Godly Purpose

Devotional: Start by Trusting God's Guidance

Starting your leadership journey with God at the center sets the foundation for all else that follows. Proverbs 3:5–6 reminds us to wholeheartedly trust God rather than relying on our own insight. In the often noisy and fast–paced world of fraternity or sorority leadership, it's tempting to depend on our own strategies or the popular opinions of peers. But wisdom from above calls us to lean into God's guidance.

To lead well in social settings, trust must be placed in God's plan, which is perfect even when circumstances seem uncertain or complex. Submitting all your ways—decisions, relationships, and priorities—to Him means seeking His counsel through prayer, Scripture, and godly mentors.

God promises to make your paths straight, even when navigating difficult social dynamics or leadership challenges. This day invites you to commit your role and responsibilities to the Lord. Ask Him specifically to show you the way to lead with integrity, humility, and love as you represent Christ among your peers.

Prayer for Today

Give me wisdom beyond my understanding, and guide my steps so I can lead with grace and truth. May I honor You in all I do and influence others toward Your love. Strengthen me when I feel pressured to conform or rely on myself. Let Your Spirit lead me into a leadership marked by humility and faithfulness. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*









Day 2: **(**) Leading with Integrity









Your Verse

Proverbs 11:3 – "The integrity of the upright guides them, but the unfaithful are destroyed by their duplicity."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 25:21 "May integrity and uprightness protect me, because my hope, Lord, is in you."
- 2 Corinthians 8:21 "For we are taking pains to do what is right, not only in the eyes of the Lord but also in the eyes of man."







Devotional: Let Integrity Shape Your Leadership

Integrity is the backbone of authentic leadership. In the fraternity and sorority world, where reputations and peer pressures often compete for attention, standing firm in what is right can be challenging.

Proverbs 11:3 assures us that our integrity will guide us safely through temptations, while duplicity—double-mindedness and deceit—ultimately leads to ruin. As a godly leader, your character should shine through in honesty, trustworthiness, and moral courage.

Integrity means consistency between who you are privately and publicly. It means not compromising your Christ-centered values for social acceptance or glory. This commitment impacts how you make decisions, interact with others, and represent your chapter.

Consider the opportunity you have to model integrity for your fraternity or sorority. Your unwillingness to cut corners or engage in gossip serves as a powerful testimony of Christ's transforming work in you. Let your leadership be a reflection of Jesus' truth.

Lord, strengthen me to lead with uncompromising integrity. Protect my heart from the temptation to be deceptive or double-minded. Help me to honor You by living transparently and uprightly in all that I do. May my actions be consistent with my faith, reflecting Your holiness. Guide me in being a trustworthy leader whose life points others to You. Use me as a light in my fraternity or sorority. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

Your Verse

Mark 10:45 – "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 2:3-4 "Do nothing out of selfish ambition... but in humility value others above yourselves."
- Galatians 5:13 "Serve one another humbly in love."







Day 3: 🎔 Leading with Servant-Heart

Devotional: Lead by Serving Humbly Like Christ

True leadership is marked by a heart to serve others. Jesus set the highest example by willingly serving even when He was King—He came not to be served, but to serve and give His life.

In fraternity and sorority leadership, it can be easy to slip into seeking status or praise. But Christ calls us to a different path: humble service focused on the well-being of others.

Serving with humility requires valuing others above ourselves. It means listening to concerns, offering support, and leading with empathy rather than ego.

Consider how your leadership can reflect servant-heartedness. Are you willing to get your hands dirty, put aside personal agendas, and prioritize the needs of your brothers or sisters? When leadership is a calling to serve, your chapter flourishes and your witness shines.

Prayer for Today

Jesus, teach me to lead with a servant's heart. Help me to put aside selfish ambitions and to prioritize the needs of those I lead. Guide me in humility, patience, and love, so my leadership reflects Your character. Let me serve with joy and grace, representing Your Kingdom well in my fraternity or sorority. Fill me with Your Spirit to lead like You did—sacrificially and selflessly. *In Your holy name, Amen.*









Day 4: Leading with Courage









Your Verse

Joshua 1:9 - "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid... for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Timothy 1:7 "God gave us a spirit not of fear but power and love and self-control."
- Psalm 27:1 "The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?"







Devotional: Courageous Leadership Rooted in Faith

Leadership often requires boldness to stand up for what is right, especially in social settings where peer pressure can be intense. God commands Joshua—and by extension, us—to be strong and courageous, trusting that He is always present.

In a fraternity or sorority, courage might mean speaking truth when it's unpopular, confronting injustice, or maintaining your Christian values even if it sets you apart.

Remember that God has not given you a spirit of fear, but one filled with power, love, and self-discipline. This means courage is not just bravado but rooted deeply in faith and self-control.

Facing challenges to your leadership or faith can be daunting. Yet, God's presence empowers you to lead boldly and influence your community for good with confidence, knowing He goes before you.







Reflect and Apply

What fears hinder you from leading boldly and fully as Christ's representative?
How can God's promise of presence and power reassure you in challenges?
When have you seen courage positively impact your leadership or chapter environment?

Prayer for Today

Lord, fill me with Your courage to lead boldly. Help me overcome fear and rely on Your power, love, and self-discipline. Remind me daily that You are with me, guiding every step. Strengthen me to stand firm for truth and righteousness in all social and leadership challenges. Use me as a fearless witness of Your Kingdom on campus. *In Jesus' mighty name, Amen.*

1 Corinthians 13:4–7 – "Love is patient, love is kind... it always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:12 "Clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."
- Ephesians 4:2 "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love."







Devotional: Lead with Christlike Love and Patience

Leadership without love quickly becomes authoritarian or self-serving. The Apostle Paul's description of love in 1 Corinthians 13 applies powerfully to leadership within any community.

As you lead your fraternity or sorority, love should inspire patience, kindness, humility, and perseverance — all vital in navigating diverse personalities, conflicts, or setbacks.

Patience with others reflects Christ's patience with us. It encourages an environment where mistakes are met with grace and challenges with gentle persistence rather than frustration or anger.

Leading with love means caring deeply about individual members as well as the larger community. It drives you to protect, trust, and never give up on those you lead—even when difficult. Ask God to fill your heart with His love, so your leadership reflects His perfect love and grace.

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 29:18 "Where there is no revelation, people cast off restraint."
- Nehemiah 2:17 "Come, let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem..."







Devotional: Cast and Communicate Godly Vision

Godly leadership requires clear vision and focus. The prophet Habakkuk was instructed to write a vision clearly so that all could understand and proclaim it. As a fraternity or sorority leader, it's important to have a God-given vision to guide your chapter toward purpose and growth.

Without vision, organizations drift and lose momentum or moral direction. With vision, members are motivated to pursue a common goal that aligns with godly values.

Godly vision is rooted in His purposes — to glorify Him, build community in love, and serve others. Take time to seek God for clarity about the direction He wants your group to go. Make that vision known clearly and passionately so others will rally alongside you.

Remember Nehemiah's leadership in rebuilding Jerusalem's walls: he shared a compelling vision that inspired action and unity despite opposition.

1 Timothy 4:12 - "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 5:16 "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father."
- Philippians 2:15 "Be blameless and pure, children of God without fault in a crooked and depraved generation."







Devotional: Be a Christlike Example Always

The most powerful way to lead is by living out your faith visibly. Paul encouraged Timothy to be an example in all areas of life, regardless of age or status. Your leadership within your fraternity or sorority carries influence far beyond your words.

In environments where behaviors and attitudes are constantly observed and imitated, your consistent, godly conduct can inspire others toward Christ.

Leading by example means integrity in speech, love in relationships, steadfast faith, and purity of heart. It requires intentional daily choices to live authentically before those you lead.

When your life reflects Christ's light and love, it not only honors God but draws others from social leadership settings to the hope and freedom found in Him.

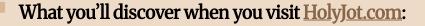
