Day 1: Teadership Exemplified

### Devotional: Lead by Serving Others Humbly

True leadership begins with humility and a heart to serve others. In John 13, Jesus models servant leadership by washing His disciples' feet, a task usually reserved for the lowliest servant. Yet, Jesus, our Lord and Teacher, inverted the expectations of leadership by doing this humble act. This teaches us that being a godly leader in hospitality means placing others' needs before our own and embracing tasks that might seem small but are essential to welcoming and honoring guests.

In hospitality and event planning, leadership can easily become about control and authority. But Jesus redirects us to lead by example and service, creating environments where everyone feels valued and cared for. Are we willing to wash the feet of those we serve, literally or figuratively?
