Devotional: The Foundation of Integrity in Leadership

Devotional: Clothing Leadership in Compassion and Kindness

Devotional: Asking God for Wisdom Daily

Devotional: Embracing Servant Leadership

Humility is the hallmark of godly leadership. Contrary to worldly leadership that often prizes power and self-promotion, Scripture teaches us to lead by valuing others and serving them.

Philippians 2:3 warns against selfish ambition and encourages us to put others first. This transforms our leadership from one of authority alone to one of servant leadership. Jesus Himself embodied this perfectly, as noted in Mark 10:44–45.

However, humility does not mean weakness or indecision. Instead, it is a posture of reliance on God and a recognition of the worth of those we lead. James 4:10 promises that humbling ourselves before the Lord elevates and strengthens us in the right way.

As a manager, leading with humility entails listening more than speaking, admitting mistakes, and empowering others. This approach builds respect and unity within your team and honors God.
