James 1:5 - "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."

Supporting Scriptures

Devotional: Ask God First for Wisdom and Direction

Before we make any plans, we must seek God's wisdom. The Bible encourages us to ask God for wisdom confidently, trusting that He will provide it generously. Planning without God's insight can lead to misguided efforts and disappointment. James reminds us that wisdom is not just for knowledge but for godly living.

Recognizing our limitations, we must *turn to the Lord with humility and faith*. Proverbs 3:5–6 invites us to trust God completely and to submit our plans to Him, promising that He will guide our steps. God's wisdom is not abstract; it's relational and practical, caring deeply about our paths and outcomes.

Proverbs 16:3 - "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 37:5 "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this."
- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."







Devotional: Commit Your Plans to God's Purposes

Making wise plans means committing them fully to God's purposes. It's not just about having good ideas but about surrendering those ideas to God's control. Proverbs 16:3 reminds us that when we commit our actions and designs to the Lord, He will establish them.

This commitment requires intentional trust and sometimes letting go of our own agendas. God promises plans that prosper and give hope (Jeremiah 29:11) when aligned with His will. What a comforting truth that our future is secure in His capable hands.

Take time today to examine your goals and ask yourself if they align with God's heart. Remember, alignment is a daily posture of trust and openness.

- Proverbs 12:15 "The way of fools seems right to them, but the wise listen to advice."







Devotional: Embrace Counsel and Correction

Wise planning involves deliberate understanding and openness to counsel.

Our impulsive decisions can lead to regrets, but listening to advice and correction builds maturity in planning. Proverbs 19:20 emphasizes accepting discipline, which is often God's way of refining us.

Wisdom preserves and protects (Ecclesiastes 7:12), so actively seeking understanding safeguards your future plans. It's wise to solicit godly counsel, weigh options, and avoid rushing decisions.

Consider who you trust for advice, and invite their perspective in your planning. Sometimes the wisest thing we do is listen patiently.

3.	How can you cultivate a heart open to discipline and teaching?

3.	Record any current plans where you'd benefit from outside input.

Day 4: Balancing Planning with Trust

Devotional: Work Hard but Trust God Deeply

Wise planning requires a balance between diligent effort and trusting God's timing. Proverbs 21:5 highlights the value of diligence—careful, thoughtful work leads to success. However, haste and anxiety often result in loss and frustration.

Jesus teaches us to prioritize God's kingdom above worrying about the future (Matthew 6:33–34). While planning is important, it must rest on a foundation of trust and surrender. God calls us to be still and know He is sovereign (Psalm 46:10).

Today, consider how your planning balances proactive diligence with peaceful trust in God's control.

Devotional: Trust God's Timing with Patient Endurance

Psalm 1:1-3 - "Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked...
They are like a tree planted by streams of water... whatever they do prospers."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 4:23 "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it."
- 1 Corinthians 10:13 "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind... God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear..."







Devotional: Guard Your Heart and Plans From Temptation

Wise planning includes protecting your heart and vision from negative influences and temptation. The psalmist paints a picture of a prosperous life rooted in righteous choices and intentional guarding of one's heart (Psalm 1:1–3). Everything we produce flows from the condition of our inner life.

Proverbs 4:23 instructs us to guard our hearts diligently, because the quality of our plans and actions originates there. Temptation and shortcuts may lure us, but God provides strength to resist (1 Corinthians 10:13).

Today, identify any attitudes or influences that might threaten the integrity of your planning. Pray for protection and wisdom to stay on God's path.

1.	Are there temptations that could derail your plans or values?
2.	How do you guard your heart in daily decisions and planning?
3.	What spiritual disciplines help you protect your vision?







Journaling Prompts

1.	List areas where you need heart-guarding and wisdom.
	Reflect on a time temptation challenged your plans and how you responded.
3.	Write a commitment prayer to guard your heart and goals.







Prayer for Today

Lord, protect my heart and plans from temptation and harm. Help me to stay rooted in Your Word and resist anything that could lead me away from Your best. Strengthen me in moments of weakness and guide me to prosper as I remain faithful. In Jesus' name, *amen*.
