Your Verse

Genesis 2:24 – "That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh."

Devotional: Marriage: A God-Ordained Union of Oneness

Devotional: Sacrificial Love: The Heart of God's Covenant

Love in marriage is not just a feeling—it is a deliberate covenant commitment. Paul's instruction in *Ephesians 5:25* challenges husbands to love sacrificially, as Christ loved the church: giving, serving, and enduring hardships for the beloved.

1 Corinthians 13 beautifully paints what covenant love looks like practically—patient, kind, and unselfish. It perseveres through difficulties and seeks the good of the other above self.

When couples embody this covenant love, their relationship becomes a powerful testimony of God's nature. This kind of love binds everything together, fostering unity and peace. Husbands are reminded in *1 Peter 3:7* to live considerately with their wives, cultivating respect and honor. When both partners lead with love and mutual regard, unity deepens and grace flows freely, building a marriage that stands firm in prayer and purpose.
