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Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day Bible Study Plan on God's Judgment and Mercy in the Book of Revelation. The final book of the Bible is often viewed with apprehension, but it offers a powerful message about *God's perfect justice*, unfailing mercy, and an urgent call to repentance. As we journey through the seals, trumpets, and bowls—three distinct cycles of divine action—we will uncover how God executes judgment on sin, yet remains patient and merciful toward humanity.

The book of Revelation reveals a cosmic battle between good and evil, with God sovereignly holding all history in His hands. This study is designed to help you grasp the deep spiritual truths behind those vivid and sometimes frightening images, understanding them not only as warnings but as expressions of God's holiness and love.

Why focus on both judgment and mercy? Because the two are inseparable in God's character. Judgment is a response to sin and rebellion, ensuring justice is served. Mercy, however, invites sinners to repent, change, and receive salvation through Jesus Christ. As Revelation unfolds, you will see God's justice acting decisively, yet His mercy persistently shining through, giving all a chance to turn back to Him.

Over the next seven days, we will study key passages that reveal this tension and harmony. Reflect on how each event challenges you personally and encourages a deeper walk with God. Whether new to Revelation or looking to



deepen your understanding, this plan aims to inspire and convict, pointing you toward hope in Christ alone.

As you read, pray for the Holy Spirit to guide you, illuminating the scriptures and moving your heart toward repentance and faith.

Devotional: Trusting God's Sovereign Judgment

Day One: Understanding God's Sovereignty through the Seals

The opening of the seven seals initiates God's unfolding plan of judgment on the earth. The four riders, culminating in Death and Hades, symbolize the serious consequences of humanity's sin and rebellion against God. Yet, behind these images is a reminder: God is sovereign. He controls the course of history, holding ultimate authority over life and death.

While these events can be sobering, they are not random acts of chaos but purposeful steps in God's righteous judgment. Romans 12:19 teaches us not to take revenge but to trust God's perfect justice. Even when evil seems rampant, God's throne is established in majesty, as Psalm 93:1 reminds us.

This day calls us to reflect on God's control amid the chaos. Do we trust Him when we see brokenness and suffering? Are we willing to submit to His authority, recognizing His judgments serve a holy purpose? As the seals break open, God's mercy still offers hope to those who repent.

1. How do the images of the four horsemen influence your understanding of God's justice?

2. In what areas of your life do you struggle to trust God's sovereignty?

3. How can trusting God's judgment inspire you to live differently today?

Day Two: Hearing God's Urgent Warning

The sounding of the trumpets ushers in a series of powerful warnings. The first four trumpets unleash natural disasters that affect the earth's ecosystems—hail, fire, a burning mountain, and darkness. These events symbolize God's call to humanity to take seriously the consequences of sin.

Like the prophet Joel's call to sound the alarm, these trumpet judgments are a wake-up call—a divine plea for repentance. They serve not only as judgment but also as mercy, giving people time to turn away from rebellion before the final bowls are poured out.

2 Peter 3:9 reminds us that God delays judgment because He desires all to repent. These trumpet events should stir our hearts to reflect: Are we responding to God's warnings today? Are we living with a repentant spirit, open to change and renewal?

Devotional: Standing Firm in Spiritual Warfare

Day Three: Recognizing the Spiritual Battle

The fifth and sixth trumpets introduce terrifying spiritual forces released on the earth. These dark powers attack those who do not have God's seal on their foreheads—those who reject Him. The Abyss and its demonic entities reveal the seriousness of spiritual warfare ongoing in the world.

Paul reminds us in Ephesians 6 that our real battle is spiritual, not against people but against evil forces. This is an encouragement to stay vigilant and grounded in God's protection. James 4:7 teaches us the practical way—to submit to God and resist the devil so Satan must flee.

These trumpet judgments warn us of the spiritual consequences of rebellion but also remind believers to stay close to God, vigilant in prayer and obedience—clothed in His armor.



Reflect and Apply

1. Are you aware of spiritual battles impacting your life or others around you?

2. How does the truth of God's power over evil influence your confidence?

3. In what ways can you better submit to God and resist temptation daily?

2. Recall a time when submitting to God helped you overcome a challenge.

3. Write a prayer surrendering your battles to God's control today.

Day Four: The Urgency of Repentance

Despite the terrifying judgments, many refuse to repent. Revelation 9:20–21 paints a sobering picture of stubbornness in sin even in the face of divine punishment. This is a clear call for us to examine our own hearts.

Acts 17:30 reminds us that God commands repentance—not optional but necessary for salvation. It is God's invitation to turn from sin and receive new life. Godly sorrow, described in 2 Corinthians 7:10, leads to true change, not just remorse or shame.

Today invites introspection. Are there areas where you resist God's correction? Is there a sincere repentance marked by transformed living? God's mercy is extended today, but time is limited.

1. What does true repentance look like in your life?

2. How does the reality of judgment motivate or challenge you to change?

3. Are there any sins or habits you need to honestly surrender to God?

Devotional: Embracing God's Just Wrath and Mercy

Day Five: The Completeness of God's Justice

The bowls of wrath represent the culmination of God's judgment—complete, just, and unavoidable for the unrepentant. From painful sores to darkness and chaos, these final judgments demonstrate God's holiness and intolerance of sin.

Prophet Nahum declares God as the avenger who will repay evil in full; Hebrews echoes this divine prerogative. God does not delight in punishment but is compelled by justice and righteousness to respond to persistent sin.

God's final wrath serves as a solemn warning to anyone who ignores His mercy. But it is also a reminder that God's discipline has a limit and that perseverance in rebellion leads to ultimate separation from Him.

1. How do the bowls of wrath challenge your view of God's justice?

2. What does God's patience and final judgment teach about His character?

3. Are you living in a way that honors God's holiness and mercy?

Through all the terrifying imagery, God desires restoration and salvation. His judgments aim to correct and call people back rather than destroy indiscriminately.
