## Devotional: Finding Safety in God's Protection

**Psalm 11 opens with a bold declaration of trust.** Despite the pressures to flee, to escape the justice-crushing environment around him, the psalmist refuses to abandon his faith. He takes refuge in the LORD, knowing God is his shelter against injustice and enemy schemes.

For those oppressed, it can be tempting to think that escape or silence is the only option. But God calls us instead to *trust Him as our fortress*. This refuge is not passive; it is active and present. God promises to uphold and protect those who rely on Him, even when the world feels unsafe.

As you begin this study, reflect on where you seek refuge in times of trouble. Do you run to God first? How does trusting in His protection change your response to injustice around you? Remember, God is not a distant observer—He is your stronghold in the storm.

## Devotional: God Sees All and Judges Justly

- *Isaiah 66:15 – “The LORD will come with fire to punish those who love violence.”*

## Devotional: Refined Through Trials and God's Hatred of Evil

**Psalm 11 reveals the refining nature of trials.** God tests the righteous—not to harm but to strengthen and purify their faith. Meanwhile, He deeply hates wickedness and those who love violence, a reminder of His passion for justice and righteousness.

For the oppressed facing hardship, this can be a source of hope: God does not ignore your suffering but uses it for your growth and ultimate good. At the same time, His fierce dislike of evil assures us that violence and injustice will not go unchecked.

This verse calls believers to perseverance and integrity, knowing that trials have a purpose and wickedness will meet God's judgment.
