Your Verse

John 14:27 - Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
- Isaiah 26:3 You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you.







Devotional: Embracing God's Unshakable Peace

Grief often stirs turmoil within us—restlessness, anxiety, and fear. Yet, Jesus offers a peace unlike anything this world can give. In John 14:27, He reassures us that His peace is a gift that calms our troubled hearts and replaces fear with trust. This peace is not dependent on circumstances; it transcends the chaos of loss and displacement.

This promise is a powerful anchor for our souls when life feels unsteady. Holding onto God's peace involves intentionally turning our minds toward Him and away from fear or despair. Day 2: 💋 Finding Rest in God









Your Verse

Matthew 11:28 - Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 34:18 The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.
- Psalm 62:1 Truly my soul finds rest in God; my salvation comes from him.







Devotional: Resting Weary Souls in God's Embrace

Grief leaves us exhausted, bearing heavy burdens of sorrow and confusion. Jesus extends a compassionate invitation in Matthew 11:28—to all who are weary—to come to Him for rest. This rest is more than physical; it speaks to the soul's deep need for healing and renewal amid pain.

Psalm 34:18 comforts us by reminding that God draws near to the brokenhearted. In moments of overwhelming loss and displacement, God is not distant or detached but intimately present, ready to save those crushed in spirit.

Accepting God's invitation means releasing the self-imposed pressure to 'manage' grief alone. It means surrendering our burdens and finding solace in God's loving arms. Psalm 62:1 further teaches that true rest and salvation are found only in God, not in fleeting distractions.

Today, consider what burdens you need to lay down. How might you approach God with the honesty and openness of a weary heart seeking rest?

Your Verse

Psalm 46:1 - God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.

Supporting Scriptures

- Nahum 1:7 The LORD is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in him.
- Psalm 91:2 I will say of the LORD, 'He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust.'







Day 3: ① God as Our Refuge

Devotional: Trusting God as a Safe Refuge When Hurting

When grief and displacement shake the very foundations of our lives, it can feel like we are left vulnerable and exposed. Yet, Scripture reassures us that God is our refuge—a safe place where we find strength and protection. Psalm 46:1 powerfully declares God's presence and help in times of trouble, affirming He is not distant but near and active in our struggles.

God's goodness is a shelter for those who trust Him, as Nahum 1:7 reminds us. In chaotic moments, God's care surrounds us with safety and hope even when circumstances feel unsafe.

Claiming God as your refuge encourages a spirit of courageous trust. Psalm 91:2 encourages us to boldly declare God as our fortress, reinforcing confidence that we do not face grief alone.

Reflect today on places where you may have tried to find refuge apart from God. How does embracing God as your fortress change your perspective on your loss and displacement?

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 61:3 To provide for those who grieve in Zion— to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes...
- Romans 8:18 I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us.







Devotional: Clinging to Hope Amidst Grief's Pain

Grief often feels endless and overpowering, yet the Bible confronts this sorrow with a profound promise of hope and restoration. Revelation 21:4 paints a beautiful picture of a future where God himself will wipe away every tear, ending death, mourning, and pain forever. This promise can bring comfort and perspective when loss feels unbearable.

Isaiah 61:3 echoes this hope, assuring us God replaces ashes—symbols of mourning—with beauty and joy. Even when life seems shattered, God is at work to transform pain into something meaningful.

Paul's words in Romans 8:18 remind believers that present hardships are temporary compared to the eternal glory God prepares for us. This hope does not negate grief but offers strength to endure it with faith that God's restoration is coming.

Today, consider the hope God offers beyond your current pain. How does this eternal perspective influence your healing journey?

Prayer for Today

Day 5: \(\rightarrow \) God's Comfort in Tears

Your Verse

Psalm 56:8 – You keep track of all my sorrows. You have collected all my tears in Your bottle. You have recorded each one in Your book.

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 God is the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles.
- Lamentations 3:31–32 For no one is cast off by the Lord forever. Though He brings grief, He will show compassion...







Day 5: OGod's Comfort in Tears

Devotional: God's Tender Care for Our Tears

Grief often pours out in tears—silent or loud expressions of our pain. Psalm 56:8 brings a tender and intimate truth: God values every tear we shed. He collects our tears in a bottle and records them, showing that no sorrow is too small or unnoticed by Him.

Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians that God is the Father of compassion who comforts us deeply in all our troubles. This comfort is not superficial but enveloping and genuine.

Even when discipline or grief comes, as Lamentations 3:31–32 acknowledges, God's compassion endures, and His love is never withdrawn. This gives us permission to grieve honestly before God, trusting He walks with us through every painful moment.

Take time today to bring your tears before God without shame or reservation, knowing He cherishes and comforts you in your sorrow.

Your Verse

Psalm 27:1 - The LORD is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?

Supporting Scriptures

- Deuteronomy 31:8 The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you or forsake you.
- Isaiah 43:2 When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through rivers, they will not sweep over you.







Devotional: God's Presence Through Life's Upheaval

Displacement, whether physical or emotional, can bring feelings of fear, insecurity, and isolation. Psalm 27:1 reminds us that the Lord is our light, salvation, and stronghold—meaning He is our protection and confident source of courage no matter what we face.

Deuteronomy 31:8 encourages us that God Himself goes ahead of us, promising never to abandon or forsake us. In the midst of upheaval, God is leading and guarding our paths with unwavering love.

Isaiah 43:2 reassures us of God's presence when passing through dangerous or uncertain waters—symbolizing times of great difficulty and change. These promises provide strong encouragement that even when uprooted or lost, God's peace and protection sustain us.

Reflect today on where you feel displaced or unsettled. How does claiming God as your stronghold impact your feelings of fear?

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:31 But those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength.







Devotional: Restoring Hope through Divine Healing

Grief can leave us feeling broken and wounded, but God specializes in healing those very places. Psalm 147:3 offers a powerful truth: God heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds. This healing is both spiritual and emotional, gently restoring what grief has damaged.

Jeremiah 31:25 assures us that God refreshes the weary and satisfies the faint—reminding us that renewal is possible even when exhaustion and despair weigh heavily.

Isaiah 40:31 provides hope that those who place their hope in the Lord will find renewed strength to persevere. Healing and strength are gifts given as we continue to rely on God's unfailing love.

Today, consider how God's healing love can meet your specific pain. How might you lean into His restoration and renew your hope?
