Devotional: God's Wisdom Is The Basis For True Justice

Prayer for Today



Day 2: Condemning Corruption and Bribery

Your Verse

Exodus 23:8 — 'Do not accept a bribe, for a bribe blinds those who see and twists the words of the innocent.'

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 17:23 'A wicked person accepts a bribe in secret to pervert the course of justice.'
- Deuteronomy 16:19 'Do not pervert justice or show partiality. Do not accept a bribe, for a bribe blinds the eyes of the wise and twists the words of the innocent.'







Day 2: Condemning Corruption and Bribery

Devotional: Reject Bribery To Uphold God's Justice

Corruption and bribery undermine the very heart of justice. Exodus 23:8 plainly warns against accepting bribes because they cloud judgment and ruin fairness.

Bribery twists truth and destroys lives by enabling the guilty and condemning the innocent. Proverbs 17:23 further emphasizes the secretive nature of this wickedness and its ruinous impact on justice.

God calls His people to live with integrity and to reject any form of dishonesty that perverts justice. This day challenges believers to examine their hearts for complicity in corruption and to commit to purity in all dealings, fostering justice without partiality or favoritism.

- Deuteronomy 1:17 'Do not show partiality in judging; hear both small and great alike.'
- Leviticus 19:15 'Do not pervert justice; do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly.'







Devotional: Fairness Reflects God's Heart for Justice

Unjust judgments disturb God's heart deeply. Proverbs 17:15 is unequivocal—God detests both acquitting the guilty and condemning the innocent.

Judges and leaders must be impartial, as Deuteronomy 1:17 and Leviticus 19:15 stress, hearing all sides and avoiding favoritism, whether toward the powerful or the poor.

This calls believers to not only expect justice but also to embody fairness in their roles and relationships. Reflecting God's character means we must stand for truth and fairness, especially when it's difficult or unpopular.

- Proverbs 31:8-9 'Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves... defend the rights of the poor and needy.'

Devotional: God Calls Us To Defend The Vulnerable

God's wisdom calls us to prioritizing the protection of society's most vulnerable. Isaiah 1:17 commands believers to actively seek justice through defending those without power or voice.

Psalm 82:3 and Proverbs 31:8-9 reinforce this divine mandate, urging us to engage personally and publicly in advocacy for the weak.

God's justice is not passive but proactive, urging believers to be a voice and defense for those marginalized by corrupt or unjust legal systems. This approach requires compassion paired with courage, rooted in the wisdom of God's heart for righteousness.

- Psalm 72:1–2 'Endow the king with your justice, O God, the royal son with your righteousness.'







Devotional: Praying For Wise And Just Leadership

Godly wisdom is essential for those who lead and make judgments. Proverbs 29:4 contrasts a leader who upholds justice with one who allows greed to destroy the nation.

Solomon's prayer in 1 Kings 3:9 highlights the desire for discernment — a wise heart to govern rightly. Psalm 72 calls for God's justice to empower leaders to rule righteously.

Leaders who apply God's wisdom can bring stability, peace, and fairness, resisting corruption and partiality. As believers, we can pray for such leaders and embody wisdom in our influence to promote just governance at every level.

- Isaiah 9:7 'Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end.'







Devotional: Trusting God's Promised Justice and Peace

Though injustice persists, God's ultimate kingdom promises perfect justice and peace. Psalm 89:14 proclaims that righteousness and justice are foundational to God's reign.

Revelation 21:4 offers hope that suffering and injustice will be no more in the new creation, while Isaiah 9:7 foretells an endless government of peace and righteousness under Christ.

This hope encourages believers to persevere in seeking justice now, trusting God's final victory. Our lives should reflect this hope by embodying justice, mercy, and faithfulness as we anticipate His kingdom.
