Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day Bible study on the Gospels, focusing on the compassionate healing and servant response shown by Jesus in Luke 4:38–39.

The Gospels reveal the life, ministry, and heart of Jesus Christ. Among the many accounts, the story of Jesus healing Peter’s mother-in-law stands out as a powerful example of how compassion leads to transformation and a ready heart to serve. In Luke 4:38–39, Jesus enters Simon Peter’s home, finds his mother-in-law sick with a fever, and heals her with a simple but authoritative command. Immediately, she rises and begins to serve them.

This brief passage encapsulates the essence of Jesus’ ministry: He cares deeply for people’s physical and spiritual needs, and His healing leads to renewed strength for service. Healing in the Gospels is not only about physical restoration but also about enabling God’s people to walk in their calling and purpose with renewed energy and joy.

Throughout this study, we’ll reflect on Jesus’ compassionate heart and how being healed—whether physically, emotionally, or spiritually—should inspire us to respond in service to others. Each day will explore different facets of Jesus healing ministry and the response it calls forth, equipping you to embrace compassion and faithful service in your own life.



As you journey with us through these scriptures, be open to what God's Spirit wants to reveal about Jesus' love, power, and invitation to partner with Him. May this week be a source of encouragement and challenge, as we learn to serve as those who have been healed to serve.





Day 1: Jesus' Compassion in Action



Day 1: 🌿 Jesus' Compassion in Action

Your Verse

Luke 4:38-39 NIV – Jesus left the synagogue and went to the home of Simon. Simon's mother-in-law was very ill with a high fever, and they asked Jesus to help her. He bent over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her.

Supporting Scriptures

- *Matthew 8:14 – Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law, and the fever left her.*
- *Mark 1:31 – Jesus took her hand and helped her up; the fever left her.*



Day 1: 🌿 Jesus' Compassion in Action

Devotional: Jesus' Compassion Initiates Healing and Service

Jesus' healing of Peter's mother-in-law reveals His deep compassion. He noticed her suffering without her asking for help, demonstrating that His love is proactive and tender. The Gospel of Luke emphasizes Jesus' authority over sickness—He simply speaks, and the illness departs.

This miracle isn't just about physical healing but restoring those in need to wholeness so they can live fully. Peter's mother-in-law's response—immediately serving those present—shows that healing often leads to renewed purpose and energy to bless others.

Today, reflect on the compassionate heart of Jesus. How does seeing His tender care challenge you to notice and respond to others' needs? Healing and service often go hand-in-hand; when we are restored, God invites us to share His love in practical ways.

Luke 4:39 NIV – He bent over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. Then she got up and began to wait on them.

- *Psalm 33:9 – For He spoke, and it came to be; He commanded, and it stood firm.*
- *John 1:1-3 – Through Him all things were made; nothing came into being without Him.*



Day 2: 🔥 The Authority of Jesus' Word

Devotional: Jesus' Word Holds Divine Healing Authority

One striking element in Jesus' healing of Peter's mother-in-law is the authority in His word. His rebuke of the fever carried power because He is the Creator speaking to His creation. When Jesus commands, sickness must obey because it contradicts the divine order.

This reminds us of the power in God's spoken word. Not only did His word bring the world into being, but it also has the authority to bring order to chaos, including sickness in people's bodies.

As believers, understanding the authority of Jesus helps us trust in His power over difficult situations, and bolsters our faith when praying for healing or breakthrough. It also calls us to listen carefully to His word, allowing it to transform us and find life, restoration, and direction.

2. In what ways can you better align your life with the authority of Jesus' word?

Day 3: ❤️ Serving as a Response to Healing

Devotional: Healing Inspires a Heart for Servant Love

The immediate response of Peter's mother-in-law after healing was to serve those around her. This teaches a powerful lesson: healing is not only about restoration but about renewed purpose—to serve God and others out of gratitude and renewed strength.

Many times when we receive God's healing or blessing, He invites us to pass on His love actively. Serving is an expression of thankfulness and participation in God's work in the world.

We are called to be servants who mirror Jesus' heart. No matter our role or occupation, our service becomes a joyful response to God's grace, allowing His kingdom to advance through our hands and hearts.

Your Verse

- *Luke 10:9 – Heal the sick and tell them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'*
- *Isaiah 61:1 – The Spirit of the Lord is on me to proclaim freedom and healing.*



Day 4: ✨ Healing as a Sign of the Kingdom

Devotional: Healing Demonstrates God's Kingdom Arrival

Jesus' healing miracles signified the arrival of God's Kingdom on earth. Each healing was a demonstration that God's promises of restoration were breaking into the broken world.

When Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law and others, He was illustrating that sickness, suffering, and oppression would not have the final word. His Kingdom is one of life, wholeness, and freedom.

As followers of Christ, we are called to carry Kingdom values – healing, hope, and restoration – in our lives and relationships. We reflect God's Kingdom when we bring healing to others—not only physically but emotionally and spiritually as well.

Jesus heals and restores not only to bless us but to empower us to be His hands and feet in the world. Peter's mother-in-law got up and served immediately, showing that healing enables effective service.

Peter's mother-in-law's healing is a reminder that God desires full restoration for His children. Many suffer in ways unseen; God's healing touch reaches deep places of brokenness to bring peace and renewal.

Faith-filled prayer invites God to intervene and bring wholeness. When we come to Him sincerely, He restores our health and revives our spirits, preparing us to live abundantly in His grace.
