Your Verse

Luke 7:37–38 – "A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume."

Devotional: The Power of Humble Approach

In the moment the unnamed woman enters the Pharisee's house, her heart shines through every drop of her tears and every act of anointing. Despite her past and the judgment she likely expected, her approach to Jesus was marked by humility and desperation for grace. This act wasn't just a ritual; it was an expression of deep repentance and recognition of Jesus' authority to forgive.

Her story encourages us to examine how we approach Jesus—with pride, with hesitation, or with open hearts ready to receive mercy. It reminds us that grace is initiated when we come to Him honestly, acknowledging our need for healing and forgiveness.

Today, consider your own posture toward Christ. What might keep you from approaching Him fully? Allow this woman's example to inspire you to come as you are, with humility and faith, trusting in His loving embrace.

Devotional: Tears: A Language of the Heart

The woman's tears were more than just sadness—they were an intimate form of worship. In the culture of her time, washing someone's feet was an act of great humility and care, usually performed by servants. But to wet Jesus' feet with tears and wipe them with her hair was a deeply personal and vulnerable act, symbolizing repentance and heartfelt adoration.

Our tears can be a sincere expression of sorrow and praise when words fail. This story invites us to worship God not only through song and speech but through our authentic emotions, trusting that He sees and values the depths of our hearts.

Reflect today on how you express your devotion to Jesus. Are there parts of your heart you have held back? Let the woman's tears inspire you to bring your authentic emotions before God in worship and repentance.

Devotional: Choosing Love Over Judgment

The Pharisee's heart was hardened by judgment, blinded to the grace unfolding before him. His critical attitude reveals how easy it is to judge others without love or understanding, missing God's work in their lives.

Contrast his reaction with Jesus' response, which is full of compassion and insight. Jesus sees the woman's love and repentance, highlighting that true judgment comes from the heart and recognizes grace rather than condemning.

This challenges us to evaluate our own hearts. How often do we judge others instead of loving them? This day calls us to adopt Christ's perspective — one of grace, mercy, and love.

How do I react when I see someone else's shortcomings or sins?
In what ways can I cultivate a heart that prioritizes grace over condemnation?
How does Jesus' example influence my view of others today?


Prayer for Today
