### Devotional: Celebrate Wins with Humility and Gratitude

Winning can be exhilarating, but humility keeps our hearts grounded.

Proverbs 27:2 reminds us that self-praise diminishes the joy of true accomplishment. In sports, it's tempting to soak in adulation, but Scripture calls us to deflect glory toward God and appreciate compliments from others.
