Your Verse

1 Thessalonians 5:18 – "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:6 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."
- Psalm 107:1 "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever."







Day 1: **B** Embracing Gratitude Amid Stress

Devotional: Choosing Gratitude Even When Anxious

Starting with God's will, 1 Thessalonians 5:18 reminds us that gratitude is not just encouraged but commanded in all circumstances, including stressful times. It may seem difficult to give thanks when anxiety and pressure mount, but the heart of faith chooses to trust God despite the immediate situation.

Paul's words guide us to see thanksgiving as a deliberate act, a spiritual discipline that aligns our hearts with God's will. When we embrace gratitude, we shift our focus from our troubles to God's unchanging goodness and love, as echoed in Psalm 107:1.

Philippians 4:6 beautifully connects thankfulness with prayer, suggesting that even as we bring our worries to God, we do so with a thankful heart. This combination invites peace into our souls and guards us from despair.

Today, begin by acknowledging the gift of thanksgiving itself. Let your heart rest in the truth that God's love endures forever, and choose to give thanks regardless of your current stress.

Your Verse

James 1:2-3 - "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 5:3-4 "Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope."
- Habakkuk 3:17–18 "Though the fig tree does not bud... yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior."







Devotional: Choosing Joy When Life is Hard

Joy amidst trials can feel paradoxical, but Scripture invites us to see hardship through the lens of God's refining work. James calls us to 'consider it pure joy' when facing difficulties because God uses these moments to build perseverance in our faith.

As we continue to trust God during stressful times, our character is crafted, and hope is strengthened, as Paul explains in Romans 5. This hope is not mere optimism but a confident expectation anchored in God's faithfulness.

Habakkuk presents a powerful example of choosing joy despite external lack. Even when nothing seems to go right, he resolves to rejoice in God, whose presence and salvation satisfy beyond earthly circumstances.

Let today's reflection invite you to find joy not because trials disappear but because God walks with you and shapes your faith through them.

Day 3: Peace That Guards Our Hearts

Your Verse

Philippians 4:7 – "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Day 3: Peace That Guards Our Hearts

Devotional: Gratitude Opens Us to God's Peace

Stress often steals our peace, but God promises a peace that goes beyond our human understanding. Philippians 4:7 assures us that this divine peace will guard our hearts and minds when we are in Christ.

Jesus emphasizes this peace in John 14, contrasting it with the temporary peace offered by the world. His peace remains steady even when external circumstances are turbulent.

Isaiah reinforces this by highlighting the connection between trust in God and experiencing perfect peace. A steadfast mind focused on God becomes a sanctuary where stress loses its grip.

Today, reflect on the gift of God's peace. How can gratitude open the door for this peace to guard your heart even in stressful moments?

Devotional: Seeing Stress Through a Grateful Lens

Gratitude changes how we see our circumstances. Colossians 3:15 calls us not only to peace but also to be thankful. When the peace of Christ rules our hearts, thankfulness becomes the natural response, especially when stress attempts to cloud our vision.

Psalm 118 reminds us that each day is a gift from God — a reason to rejoice and be glad regardless of current trials. This daily rejoicing is an act of faith that reframes our mindset.

Similarly, 1 Chronicles 16 celebrates God's enduring love and goodness, anchoring our gratitude on unchanging truths rather than fleeting feelings.

Today's focus is to recognize how gratitude invites us to see beyond our stress and choose joy in God's goodness every day.

Paul's teaching to Timothy reminds us that everything God made is good and is to be received with thanksgiving, highlighting the holistic nature of this practice in our daily lives.
