Devotional: Understanding Salvation as a Gift

Devotional: Thankfulness Rooted in Eternal Perspective

Romans 5:3–5 expands on this by showing how suffering builds character and hope, reminding us that trials have purpose in God's plan. Salvation ensures our hope remains anchored beyond the temporary difficulties we face.

2 Corinthians 4:17 puts earthly troubles in perspective, promising eternal glory that far outweighs our present pain. When we fix our eyes on the eternal salvation we have received, thankfulness grows, even when situations are tough.

Today, reflect on how your salvation provides strength and hope in trials. Let gratitude anchor you in God's promises and encourage you to trust Him fully.
