Devotional: Why Godly Mentors Are Essential for Teens

Why do we need mentors? As a teen, you face many decisions, challenges, and questions about life, faith, and your future. Proverbs 1:5 reminds us that being wise means actively listening to others and seeking guidance. God often speaks through the people He has placed in our lives — people who have walked the path before us.

Mentors serve as spiritual guides, cheerleaders, and counsellors. They have learned from their experience and from God's Word. They can offer advice when you're stuck and encouragement when you're discouraged. Don't underestimate the power of having someone mature in faith walk alongside you.

Mentors help bridge the gap by helping you understand and apply God's wisdom in everyday life. Ecclesiastes 4:9 highlights that we are better together. You don't have to figure everything out alone — building godly relationships strengthens your walk.

Devotional: The Power of Listening and Accepting Guidance

Being open to advice and correction is challenging, especially as a teen when you are discovering your independence. Yet, Proverbs 19:20 teaches that true wisdom comes from *listening* to advice and accepting discipline. This is not about punishment but about loving correction that helps you grow.

Sometimes, receiving advice that challenges us can feel uncomfortable or even frustrating. But Hebrews 12:11 reminds us that discipline — though hard at first — leads to righteousness and peace in the long run. Those who learn from correction mature and develop strong character.

In Psalm 25:4-5, David models the attitude we need: a humble heart that asks God to teach and guide him. When you seek God's truth sincerely, He will use mentors and His Word to shape your life.

Today, try to intentionally listen for God's voice through wise people around you. Consider their advice carefully instead of dismissing it. Remember that God loves you too much to leave you to figure life out on your own.

Don't isolate yourself; instead, open your life fully to God's family — mentors, peers, and others who walk with Him.

Today, commit to building strong relationships where you both receive and share God's wisdom. Pray for the courage and love needed to grow and to help others grow in faith too.
