Devotional: The Strength Found in Church Community

- Ephesians 4:15 "Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ."
- 1 Thessalonians 5:11 "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing."







Day 2: 6 Growing in Faith and Love

Devotional: Rooted in Christ, Growing in Love

Church is more than a weekly meeting; it's where faith grows deep and love overflows. When you first come to faith, you are like a seed planted in good soil, and being part of a church helps you grow strong roots.

- Matthew 20:28 "Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."







Day 3: W Serving and Loving Like Jesus

Devotional: Serving Others with Jesus' Love

Being part of the church means living out our faith through service and love. When teens engage in serving others, they reflect Jesus' heart and grow in compassion and humility.

1 Peter 4:10 reminds us to use our unique gifts to serve, seeing them as a precious trust from God. Service isn't only about big things—it can be simple acts of kindness, helping at church events, or reaching out to someone in need.

Jesus set the ultimate example of serving others, even giving His life for us. John 13:34 commands us to love one another just as Jesus loved us. Loving service shows people around us the reality of God's grace and care. When you serve, you participate in God's work and experience joy in making a difference.
