## Growth: From Pride to Servanthood Like Jesus



Explore how true growth happens when pride is crushed through joyful, willing service, following Jesus' example of humble servanthood.





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#### Introduction

Grow in grace by embracing servanthood. Many people see growth as climbing ladders, gaining status, or asserting their own importance. However, *The Bible reveals a different way to grow—through humble, joyful service to others, just as Jesus lived and taught.* This 21-day journey will guide you in understanding the tension between pride and servanthood and how God's transforming power leads us to live like Jesus.

Why pride? Why servanthood? Pride is often the root of many struggles; it contains the desire to exalt ourselves above others and even God. Yet, Jesus, the Son of God, set a stunning example by embracing humble service, washing His disciples' feet, and ultimately laying down His life.

This plan invites you to explore key biblical passages that highlight this tension, encouraging you to reflect on your own heart posture and to take practical steps toward living with a servant's heart. Each day offers foundational scriptures, supportive verses, thoughtful devotionals, deep reflection, journaling prompts, and prayers to equip and inspire you.

As you move through these 21 days, you will discover that true spiritual growth is not about elevating self, but about following Jesus in lowering ourselves for the sake of others—willingly and joyfully.

Let us embark together on this transformative path, that pride may be crushed and servanthood may flourish in our daily lives, reflecting Christ's

#### Devotional: Humility: The Starting Point of Growth

Humility is the soil where growth begins. When we think about spiritual growth, we often imagine gaining insight, power, or status. Yet the Bible teaches that growth starts by embracing humility—recognizing our own need for God and valuing others above ourselves.

In Philippians 2:3, Paul exhorts believers to discard selfish ambition and vain conceit, urging us instead to live with a humble perspective that honors others. This attitude is countercultural in a world obsessed with 'me first' and 'look at me.'

Pride erects barriers between us and God, between us and one another. When God opposes the proud (James 4:6), it means that pride blocks His grace and growth. But when we humble ourselves, submitting to God's will, He promises to lift us up (1 Peter 5:6). This divine exchange—lowering ourselves so God can elevate us—is the essence of growth.

Today, ask yourself: Where in my heart have I been harboring pride? How can I begin to replace that with true humility that serves and honors others as Jesus did?

Growth then is not the fruit of self-exaltation but the harvest of humble faith, shaped when pride is confronted, crushed, and surrendered.
