Understanding the destructive power of wrath is the first step toward true growth. By recognizing how anger stirs conflict and sin, we become motivated to surrender it. Wrath isolates and wounds, but God calls us to a better way—one marked by patience, self-control, and forgiveness.

Today, ask God to help you perceive the times your wrath has taken root and how it has affected you and others. Growth begins as we bring these struggles before Him.

Day 2: 💔 The Weight of Unforgiveness

#### Devotional: Unforgiveness Blocks God's Forgiveness

Unforgiveness is a heavy burden that entangles the heart and feeds the flames of wrath. Jesus' words in Matthew make it clear: forgiveness is not optional but essential for the believer's own forgiveness. When we refuse to forgive, we resist God's mercy and keep ourselves imprisoned by pain and anger.

- Galatians 5:22–23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."







Day 3: **B** Growth Begins with Grace

#### Devotional: Grace Enables a New Way of Living

Growth is not instantaneous; it is a process empowered by grace. Ephesians calls us to intentionally rid ourselves of bitterness, rage, and anger—attitudes fueled by wrath—and to replace them with kindness, compassion, and forgiveness modeled on Christ.

Paul reminds us in Romans not to pursue revenge but to trust God's justice. Attempting to settle scores ourselves perpetuates wrath and stunts spiritual growth.

The fruits of the Spirit listed in Galatians demonstrate the qualities that flourish when we live by God's Spirit rather than our own impulses. Selfcontrol, gentleness, and patience counteract the destructive cycles of wrath.

*Grace enables us to put aside destructive emotions and grow into the character of Christ.* This allows forgiveness to blossom where there was once pain and anger.

Begin today by inviting God's grace to soften your heart, cultivate compassion, and enable you to forgive as Christ forgave you.

#### Devotional: The Power of Gentle Words

One of the most powerful defenses against wrath is the way we respond in speech and attitude. Proverbs reminds us that a gentle answer can defuse anger, breaking cycles of wrath before they escalate. Conversely, harsh words only fuel more anger and deepen wounds.

James warns that controlling our tongue is key to authentic faith. Our words reveal the condition of our hearts—uncontrolled anger can invalidate our witness and damage relationships.

Psalm 4:4 teaches us to be mindful not to sin in anger or allow it to linger. Holding on to wrath overnight hardens the heart and obstructs peace.

Guarding your heart and words is essential in the growth process, helping you resist the temptation to stir wrath. Choose gentleness and timely resolution over reactive anger.

Today, reflect on how your speech either guards against or fuels wrath. Ask God to help you respond with grace and patience.

Forgiveness is a reflection of God's very nature—a heart defined by love and compassion. John teaches that love originates with God, and those who love demonstrate the reality of knowing Him.

The Psalms describe God as gracious, compassionate, slow to anger, and abounding in faithful love.

Micah marvels at God's willingness to pardon and forgive despite our failings.

When we forgive, we mirror God's heart, allowing His love to shine through us in a broken world. This reflecting of God's nature is a key marker of spiritual growth and maturity.

Today, meditate on God's compassion and ask to embody that same love through forgiveness.

Paul talks about pressing forward, forgetting what lies behind and focusing on the future God has called us to.

Choosing to let go of past hurts and anger allows us to move forward, experiencing the freedom and growth God intends. Holding on only weighs us down and hinders progress.

Today, identify what you need to release and ask God to help you fully let go.

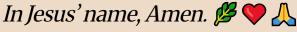
