Devotional: Living Out God's Fruit

Grandchildren observe more than they hear. The fruit of the Spirit in your life paints a vivid picture of who God is. Galatians 5:22-23 describes qualities that reveal God's heart to those who watch and listen.

Demonstrating kindness, patience, and gentleness creates a safe space for grandchildren to ask questions without fear or judgment. Proverbs encourages us to hold love and faithfulness close, making them visible through both action and word.
