Psalm 127:3 - "Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 19:14 "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them..."
- Proverbs 22:6 "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it."







Devotional: Recognizing Children as God's Gift

Psalm 127:3 reminds us that children are gifts entrusted to us by God. They are not just blessings but sacred responsibilities. When we recognize children as a divine heritage, it shifts our perspective on parenting and caregiving into a spiritual calling.

Creating a prayer journal together begins by celebrating this gift. Invite your children to name things they are thankful for, helping them see themselves as cherished by God. Today, pray with them, thanking God for the unique blessing each of them is.

As you write, encourage children to express their own thoughts and prayers, no matter their age. This practice plants seeds of faith early and nurtures a lasting relationship with God.

Devotional: Trusting God's Plans for Children

Jeremiah 29:11 assures us that God has good plans for our children's future.

When we pray for their hearts, we ask God to guide their choices, shape their character, and give them peace and hope amidst life's challenges.

Today's prayer journal entry can include praying specifically for your child's emotions, decisions, and future. Encourage your children to share what they hope for and write these hopes in your journal, turning them over to God in prayer.

Involving children in praying for themselves and their peers helps nurture empathy and trust in God's purposes. It also reminds them they are part of God's bigger story.

- Proverbs 18:10 "The name of the Lord is a fortified tower; the righteous run to it and are safe."







Day 3: • Protecting Children in Prayer

Devotional: God's Shield Around Our Children

Psalm 91:11 reminds us that God faithfully protects His children. As parents and caregivers, we have the privilege of praying for God's protection over every aspect of their lives—their bodies, minds, hearts, and environments.

Prayer journaling about protection can include writing specific prayers against fears, dangers, and temptations. Encourage your children to identify things they want God's help to guard them from, making prayer realistic and personal.

Teaching your child to seek refuge in God like the 'fortified tower' mentioned in Proverbs 18:10 builds their confidence in spiritual safety. This is a powerful lesson alongside physical and emotional protection.

Day 3: Protecting Children in Prayer

Prayer for Today

Lord, we ask for Your divine protection over our children. Surround them with Your angels and keep them safe in every step and situation. Help us to teach their hearts to run to You as a safe refuge. Remove any fears and strengthen their trust in Your mighty power. We pray Your peace will guard their minds and hearts today. *Be their fortress and shield.*



















Your Verse

2 Timothy 3:15 – "...the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 2:6-7 "...continue to live your lives rooted and built up in him..."
- Deuteronomy 6:6-7 "Impress them on your children...talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road."







Devotional: Planting Spiritual Roots Through Scripture

2 Timothy encourages us that Scripture is foundational for children's faith.Growing in faith involves regular engagement with God's Word together as a family. Our prayer journals can document the ways God speaks and grows us through His promises.

Creating a habit of reading and praying Scripture together establishes spiritual roots that will flourish through life's seasons. Use your journal to write down favorite verses, prayers inspired by the Bible, and lessons learned.

This practice helps children internalize God's truth and see prayer as a natural response to His Word. It also fosters meaningful family conversations about faith.

- John 13:34 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another."







Devotional: Embracing Love That Builds and Heals

Love is the foundation of how we relate to our children and to each other. The famous passage in 1 Corinthians 13 challenges us to embody a love that is patient, kind, trusting, and persevering. Incorporating these qualities into parenting and prayer equips children to receive God's love and reflect it to others.

Prayer journaling today can focus on expressing God's love and asking Him to fill your family's hearts with grace. Encourage children to pray for one another and write down ways to show love practically within the family and beyond.

Living out God's love creates lasting bonds and peaceful homes. It also teaches children how to love well even when challenges arise.

Devotional: Leading Children by Our Faith Example

Parents and caregivers are a primary influence on children's spiritual formation. Deuteronomy reminds us to teach God's ways consistently by word and example day after day. Our actions often speak louder than words, making a prayer journal a valuable tool to remind us of our commitments.

Today, reflect on the example you set for your children in prayer, kindness, and faith. Use your journal to note specific ways you model these truths and areas for growth.

Children learn trust, courage, and love by watching how we live. Committing to this Bible study shows your dedication to leading well and inviting your children to join you in faith.
