Discover God's hope and healing through a 21-day journey focused on recovery from self-harm, embracing grace, restoration, and renewed purpose.





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Introduction

Welcome to your 21-day journey of healing and recovery. Recovery from self-harm can feel overwhelming, isolating, and painful. But *you are not alone*. God's Word offers deep wells of hope, compassion, and restoration for every broken place within us. Over the next three weeks, we will explore Scripture that addresses pain, healing, identity, and freedom — helping you uncover God's truth about your worth and His power to restore.

Self-harm often stems from deep emotional wounds, feelings of despair, or a desire to regain control. Yet, Scripture invites us to bring our pain to God — to expose our brokenness to the Healer who binds up the wounded and sets captives free (Psalm 147:3). This study will gently guide you into those promises, encouraging you to cast your burdens and find renewed strength in God's love.

Each day includes a primary Scripture paired with supporting verses, a devotional to encourage and uplift, reflective questions to deepen your understanding, journaling prompts to help process your journey, and a prayer to anchor your day in God's grace.

Remember, recovery is not linear — it's a process of grace, perseverance, and faith. There may be setbacks, but God's steadfast love never fails. As you engage with these Scriptures and reflections, may you experience God's peace, restoration, and a fresh vision for your life.







God is near to the brokenhearted, ready to heal and renew your spirit. Let's step forward in faith together.

















Your Verse

Psalm 147:3 - "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."

Supporting Scriptures

Devotional: God's Tender Healing Touch

Today marks the first step in your recovery journey—a step into the healing arms of God. Self-harm arises from places of deep hurt, but **God sees your pain and desires to heal it.** Psalm 147:3 assures us that God doesn't ignore broken hearts; instead, He gently binds up our wounds. Imagine His hands tenderly mending what feels irreparable.

God's healing is both spiritual and emotional. He lovingly offers restoration no matter how shattered you feel. Your worth isn't defined by past pain but by His unfailing love.

When fear or despair arise, remember Isaiah 41:10's promise: God is with you, giving strength. You are never alone in your struggle. Each small step toward recovery is met with His grace.

Invite God into your pain today. Give Him your broken places and trust in His healing power.

Devotional: Embracing Your New Identity

Recovery is not about dwelling on past mistakes or pain. God invites you into a new identity—one marked by hope and renewal. 2 Corinthians 5:17 reminds us that in Christ we become new creations, with the past's chains broken.

This means your history of self-harm does not define you. God is actively rewriting your story. Isaiah encourages us to forget former things—not to ignore them, but to stop being trapped by them—and to embrace God's new work in your life.

The grace of God cancels condemnation, leaving space only for freedom (Romans 8:1). It's a fresh start available to you each day, no matter what yesterday looked like.

Embrace this new beginning today. Lean into God's transforming love and allow Him to restore your heart and mind.

What would it look like to fully accept God's promise of a new creation in your life?
In what ways can you practice forgetting former things and focusing on God's new work?

Devotional: Receiving God's Peace Daily

Anxiety and turmoil often accompany emotional wounds and temptations to self-harm. But God offers a supernatural peace—one that goes beyond what we can fully grasp.

Philippians 4:6-7 encourages us not to be anxious but to present our concerns to God through prayer. When we do, His peace will act as a guard for our hearts and minds, protecting us from despair.

Jesus Himself promised to give us peace that the world cannot offer (John 14:27). This peace is steady and sustaining, especially when we fix our minds on trusting God (Isaiah 26:3).

Today, let your heart rest in God's peace. Bring your fears before Him and choose to trust that He is in control, even in the midst of challenges.

2 Corinthians 12:9 – "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."
- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."







Devotional: God's Power in Our Weakness

When battling urges or feelings of vulnerability, it's easy to feel weak and helpless. Yet, God's Word tells us that our human weakness can become the place where His power shines brightest.

In 2 Corinthians 12:9, Paul shares God's promise: His grace is enough, and His strength is made perfect in our weakness. This means that when we recognize we cannot heal on our own, we open the door for God's mighty power to work in us.

Isaiah reminds us that God gives strength to the weary. No matter how exhausted or broken you feel, God is ready to renew your energy and sustain you.

Lean into God's strength today rather than trying to carry the weight alone. Let Him be your refuge and power.

Day 5: 🞇 Identity in God's Love

Devotional: Rooting Your Identity in God's Love

The journey of recovery is deeply connected to understanding who you are in God's eyes. Self-harm often comes with feelings of shame or unworthiness. Yet, Scripture reveals a powerful truth: nothing can separate you from God's love.

Romans 8:38–39 declares that no hardship, fear, or failure can break God's embrace. You are His beloved child, cherished beyond measure.

Ephesians 2:10 labels you as God's masterpiece—fearfully and wonderfully made with a unique purpose. This is not based on your performance but on His love.

Today, choose to view yourself through God's eyes. Let His unwavering love redefine your identity and empower your healing.

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Timothy 1:7 "God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power, love, and self-control."
- Philippians 4:8 "Think about whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable..."







Devotional: Transforming Your Thoughts with Truth

Recovery is not just physical—it happens in your mind and spirit as well. Negative thoughts can fuel self-harm urges, but God calls us to a mental transformation.

Romans 12:2 encourages believers to be transformed through renewed thinking. This means intentionally replacing harmful thought patterns with God's truth.

God has empowered you to live with a spirit of power, love, and self-control (2 *Timothy 1:7*). You don't have to be captive to fear or destructive thoughts.

Philippians 4:8 offers a guide for what to focus on: things that are true, pure, and praiseworthy.

Today, practice renewing your mind by flooding it with God's word and promises.

Devotional: Receiving God's Boundless Grace

Shame and guilt often follow self-harm, but God's grace is greater than any regret.

Ephesians 1:7 reminds us that through Jesus' sacrifice, we have redemption and forgiveness. No sin or action is beyond God's power to cleanse.

Psalm 103:12 beautifully illustrates the extent of God's forgiveness—removing our sins as far as east is from west.

1 John 1:9 encourages honest confession to receive cleansing and restoration. God's grace is steady and faithful, eagerly waiting to cover your mistakes and begin anew.

Today, receive God's grace and forgive yourself as He forgives you. Healing begins when we rest in His mercy.

Day 8: Preaking Chains of Shame

Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 61:1 "He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted... to set the captives free."
- John 8:36 "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."







Day 8: Preaking Chains of Shame

Devotional: Freedom from Shame Through Christ

Shame can feel like a heavy chain that holds you captive in hurt and isolation. But God's heart beats for the brokenhearted.

Psalm 34:18 promises God's nearness to those crushed in spirit. You don't have to carry shame alone—God wants to rescue and restore you.

Isaiah 61:1 reveals God's mission to bind up wounds and set captives free. This includes freedom from shame's bondage.

John 8:36 reminds us that true freedom comes from Christ. No shame or past mistake can hold you if you walk in His liberation.

Devotional: Clinging to God's Hope

Jeremiah 29:11 offers a beautiful assurance that God's plans include hope, prosperity, and care. Even if your present feels dark, God is already preparing pathways to healing and joy.

Romans 15:13 prays for you to be filled with joy and peace by trusting God's hope. Your trust is the seed from which healing grows.
