Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 — "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 61:1 "He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted..."
- Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."







Day 1: 💋 Finding Worth Beyond Pain

Devotional: Embracing Your True Worth in God's Eyes

Many women facing narcissistic abuse feel crushed and broken, believing their worth is tied to pain and rejection. Yet, Scripture tells us that God is especially close to those who are hurt, tenderly saving and comforting them. Healing begins by accepting that your true value is not measured by how others treat you but by how God sees you.

Take a moment to breathe in God's love. In Psalm 34:18, the Lord promises His nearness to the brokenhearted. This is not just a promise of presence but a declaration that He is actively working to save and restore you from the inside out. Your past wounds do not define your future identity; God's love does.

Remember, even in your lowest moments, **His heart beats for you**. You are cherished beyond measure—created in His image, redeemed by His grace, and destined to live in freedom.

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you."







Day 2: ① Overcoming Fear with God's Peace

Devotional: Letting God's Peace Drive Out Fear

Fear is a common companion after narcissistic abuse, yet God offers a peace that conquers fear completely. In Isaiah 41:10, God assures us of His presence and strength when we feel dismayed or afraid. This is a divine invitation to lean not on our own understanding but to trust the One who holds all things together.

Fear breeds isolation; peace restores community and connection. The Spirit God gives is not timid but powerful, full of love and self-discipline. When fear arises, it's an opportunity to practice surrender and call upon God's calming presence.

Remember Jesus' words in John 14:27 — His peace is not as the world gives. It is steadfast and unshakable. Holding onto this promise will help you step beyond fear and into courage.

- Matthew 6:14 "If you forgive others, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







Day 3: SFreedom in Forgiveness

Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness for Your Soul's Freedom

Forgiveness is often misunderstood as condoning harm, but Scripture invites us to embrace it as a pathway to freedom. In relationships marred by narcissistic abuse, bitterness and anger can deepen wounds. Instead, God calls us to kindness and compassion—not because of what we deserve but because of what He has given us.

Forgiveness opens the prison doors for the soul. It does not erase the past or deny justice but releases the burdens that keep us chained to pain. By forgiving, we echo God's own forgiveness towards us—a powerful act of grace.

Reflect on Ephesians 4:31–32 and ask God to help you let go of bitterness. This is a step toward reclaiming your peace and reclaiming your story. God's love empowers you to heal, forgive, and move forward into wholeness.

1.	What feelings arise when you consider forgiving those who hurt you?
2.	How does God's forgiveness of you motivate your ability to forgive?
3.	What steps can you take to begin releasing bitterness today?







Day 3: 🖏 Freedom in Forgiveness

Journaling Prompts

1.	Write a letter expressing your feelings but choosing forgiveness (no need to send).
2.	List ways forgiveness can free you personally and spiritually.
3.	Pray for strength to forgive and for God to heal your wounds.







Day 3: 😂 Freedom in Forgiveness

Prayer for Today

Lord, forgiving hurts feels impossible sometimes. Give me grace to release bitterness and resentment. Help me to forgive as You forgave me, reflecting Your love and mercy. I choose freedom over pain and peace over anger. Heal my heart and guide my steps forward. Amen. **

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Day 4: (Healing Identity in Christ

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 5:17 — "If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live... Christ lives in me."
- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you... plans to give you hope and a future."







Day 4:
 Healing Identity in Christ

Devotional: Embracing a New Identity Rooted in Christ

Narcissistic relationships often warp personal identity, but God offers a new, unshakable identity in Christ. According to 2 Corinthians 5:17, when we accept Christ, we become brand new creations—our past pain does not dictate who we are.

This newness is a radical healing of self-perception and purpose. You are not your shame, your fear, nor your mistakes. You are deeply loved and fearfully and wonderfully made.

In Galatians 2:20, Paul expresses that his life is now defined by Christ living within him. This is your story too—a life transformed, empowered, and bearing the fruit of God's love and strength. Jeremiah 29:11 assures us that God's plans for us are filled with hope and a future that transcends past suffering.

Reflect and Apply

1.	How has past abuse influenced your self-image?
2.	What does it mean to you that you are a new creation in Christ?
3.	How can embracing your new identity bring freedom from former hurts?

1.	List negative beliefs about yourself and rewrite them through God's truth.
2.	Describe the hope and future God promises you.
3.	Write a prayer declaring your new identity in Christ.

Day 5: Strength for the Journey

Devotional: Relying on God's Strength Every Step

Healing is a journey requiring strength beyond our own, and God promises to provide it abundantly. Sometimes the road is difficult and exhausting, but in Christ, you have the power to persevere.

Philippians 4:13 isn't just a motto—it's a lifeline. When you feel weak, God's strength is made perfect in your weakness (2 Corinthians 12:9). Psalm 46:1 reminds us that God is a refuge, a safe place where strength is found even in chaos.

Rest in the promise of Isaiah 40:31 that hope in the Lord renews your strength like eagles soaring—grace lifts you beyond pain and fear to embrace victory and peace. Lean into God's sustaining power today.

Day 6: SEmbracing God's Love Fully

Devotional: Resting Fully in God's Unfailing Love

One of the deepest wounds from narcissistic abuse is feeling unloved or unlovable. God's Word uproots this lie by revealing a love so powerful nothing can separate us from it.

Romans 8:38–39 declares that no hardship or threat can break God's embrace. His perfect love removes fear and empowers healing. This love is unconditional, relentless, and renewing.

1 John 4:18 reminds us that where God's perfect love is, fear loses its grip. You are held by a mighty God (Zephaniah 3:17) whose joy and salvation are your security. Open your heart wide to receive this love. Let it fill every crack left by pain and shape your future with hope.

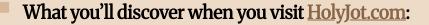




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
