Devotional: Trusting God to Heal Your Broken Heart

Day 2: V Facing the Pain with Honesty

Devotional: Courage to Face Your Deepest Hurts

Healing cannot begin without honestly facing the pain caused by infidelity. It's tempting to bury emotions or dismiss the hurt, but God calls us to a raw, truthful encounter with our feelings. Psalm 34:18 assures us that God is near when we are brokenhearted and crushed, not far away.

Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness to Release Bitterness

Forgiveness is perhaps the most difficult step after infidelity, yet it is essential for true freedom and healing. Ephesians 4:31–32 calls us to release bitterness and choose kindness and compassion, modeling the forgiveness God has shown us in Christ.

Forgiving doesn't mean forgetting or excusing the betrayal; it means choosing to release the hold that hatred and resentment have on your heart. Colossians 3:13 encourages us to patiently bear with each other and forgive repeatedly, reflecting God's limitless grace.

Jesus teaches in Matthew 18 that forgiveness is not a one-time act but a continual choice. This ongoing forgiveness paves the way for healing and renewed intimacy, offering freedom to both the hurt and the one who harmed.
