Day 1: The Bread of Life









Your Verse

John 6:35 - "Then Jesus declared, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.""

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 4:4 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'
- Psalm 34:8 'Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him.'







Devotional: Jesus Fills Our Deepest Longings

Many of us have searched for satisfaction in food, hoping it will fill an emptiness inside. Yet, no amount of eating truly satisfies the soul. Jesus offers a different kind of bread—one that nourishes our spirit and meets our deepest needs.

In John 6, Jesus calls Himself the "bread of life," promising that those who come to Him will never hunger or thirst again. This is an invitation to find our most profound fulfillment in His presence instead of temporary pleasures.

Reflect on what "bread of life" means to you. How can trusting Jesus as your true sustainer help reorient your cravings and desires? Today, consider surrendering your appetite for control over food to the One who alone can satisfy your soul.

Devotional: Transforming Thoughts to Break Addiction

Food addiction often starts with patterns of thinking that keep us trapped: feelings of shame, stress, or hopelessness that automatically trigger overeating. God invites us to renew our minds—transforming destructive thoughts into godly ones.

The Apostle Paul encourages believers not to conform to worldly patterns but to be changed by a renewal of the mind. This process is crucial in addiction recovery. As we replace lies with God's truth and negative self-talk with His promises, we gain power to resist old habits.

Consider what thoughts feed your addiction and begin to identify lies that need replacing with Scripture. Meditate on truths like your identity in Christ and God's love for you. This spiritual mindset shift opens the door to true healing.

Devotional: God's Power When We Feel Weak

Recovery can feel hard and discouraging, especially when you face setbacks or temptations. God's grace sustains us in moments of weakness and reveals His power through our dependence on Him.

Paul's testimony in 2 Corinthians reminds us that God's power is strongest when we admit how weak and vulnerable we are. Instead of relying on your own strength to overcome addiction, lean into God's strength daily.

Embrace your weakness as a space for God's grace to work deeply. When cravings arise, turn to Him with honest prayer and trust He will provide the power needed to resist and heal.

Day 4: **B** Restoring Our Hearts

Devotional: God's Healing for Wounded Hearts

Hurt, trauma, and brokenness often contribute to addictive behaviors. God is compassionate and desires to heal the brokenness in your heart that food addiction tries to cover up.

Psalm 147 assures us that God binds up wounds and restores health. Healing is a journey, but it begins with allowing God to touch your pain and carry your burdens.

Invite God to meet you in your pain today. Seek His comfort and healing as you confront emotional wounds. Trust that true restoration comes from His loving hands.

Day 11: V Embracing God's Love

Devotional: Accepting Unchanging Divine Love

Feelings of unworthiness or shame often accompany addiction. Yet God's love for you is constant and never-ending, completely unconditional and available through Christ Jesus.

Paul assures us nothing can separate us from God's love. Accepting this love transforms how we treat ourselves and breaks chains of shame.

Open your heart to receive God's perfect love. Let that love heal wounds and restore worth that addiction may have blurred.

Devotional: Overcoming Addiction's Grip by Faith

Addiction often acts like a stronghold—powerful, controlling, and difficult to break without divine intervention.

Paul reminds us that our spiritual weapons carry divine power to demolish such strongholds. This means through faith, prayer, Scripture, and God's armor, we can overcome even the strongest chains of addiction.

Devotional: Spirit-led Life Overcomes Fleshly Cravings
