Day 1: V God Is Your Refuge

Devotional: Finding Safety in God's Presence

Devotional: Allowing God to Mend Your Heart

Bullied hearts often feel shattered—wounded deeply on the inside. But God not only sees your pain; He is ready to heal it. Psalm 147:3 beautifully reminds us that God acts to mend broken hearts and bind up the wounds bullying has caused.

This healing may not be instant and sometimes demands patient surrender. God's restoration often happens in both visible and invisible ways—through prayer, support, scripture, and nurturing yourself emotionally and spiritually.

Invite God to heal today by bringing Him your brokenness freely, trusting that His love is greater than any hurt you've endured. Let His Word comfort you and bring new hope for recovery.

Devotional: Transforming Thoughts with God's Truth

Bullying can embed harmful thoughts about yourself—lies that tell you're worthless or unloved. Romans 12:2 urges us not to conform to those negative patterns but to allow God to renew our minds. This renewal is essential for mental health after trauma.

By intentionally filling your mind with God's truth, you replace hurtful beliefs with God's perspective of your value and identity in Him. This may involve memorizing Scripture, meditating on God's promises, and challenging distorted thoughts actively.

God helps you think differently — think with hope, truth, and love. Commit today to invite His Spirit to transform your mind and shape your emotions for healing.

Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Our Weakness

Experiencing bullying trauma can leave you feeling weak, exhausted, and helpless. The good news is that God's grace meets you precisely in those moments of weakness. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12:9 remind us that God's power shines brightest when we acknowledge our fragility.

You don't have to pretend to be strong or hide your wounds. Instead, trust God to infuse you with strength beyond your own abilities. Lean on Him daily—He will carry you through pain and give the endurance needed for healing.

Admit your weakness and receive God's grace—there, His power will restore and sustain you.

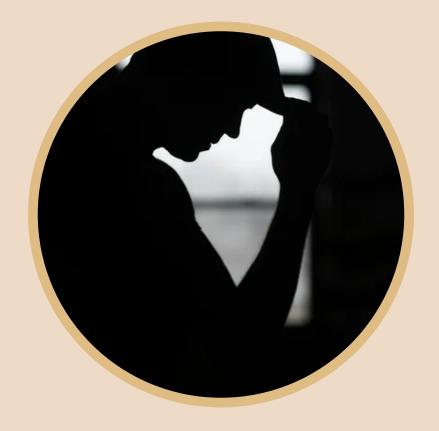

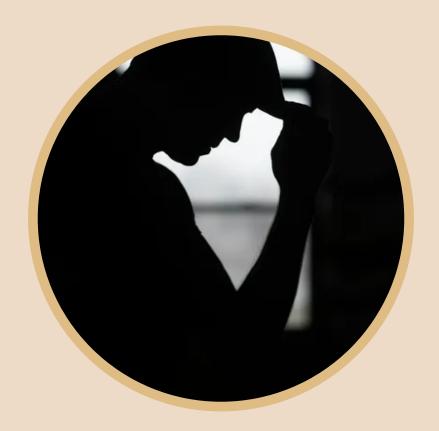
