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Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day study on healing from the pain of parental favoritism.

Psalm 139:13 "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb."

Devotional: You Are Fearfully and Wonderfully Made

The pain of favoritism often attacks our self-worth. It whispers lies that we are less loved or less valuable. Psalm 139 reminds us of a profound truth: we are wonderfully made by God Himself. Your value is rooted in the fact that God carefully and lovingly created you before birth. His intimate involvement in your formation shows that you are precious beyond comparison.

God's craftsmanship does not favor one child over another; He cherishes each soul uniquely and intentionally. This is a powerful foundation for healing because it redirects your focus from human rejection to divine acceptance. Your worth does not come from human approval or family roles—it comes from the One who knew you first and loves you eternally.

Take time today to reflect on how God sees you. Let this truth sink deep and begin to dismantle the lies left behind by favoritism.

- Romans 12:3 "Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment."







Devotional: Breaking Free from the Comparison Trap

Comparison is a thief of joy and a root of many emotional wounds. In families where favoritism exists, comparing ourselves to siblings or others can become a daily struggle. Galatians 6 encourages us to take pride in our own actions and identity instead of constantly measuring ourselves against others.

This step toward healing involves recognizing the destructive impact of comparison and choosing to see ourselves through God's balanced perspective. Rather than feeding bitterness or feelings of inadequacy, we are called to sober judgment—an honest, humble view of ourselves based on God's truth, not human opinions or status.

Today, ask the Lord to help you release comparisons. Celebrate the unique qualities He has placed in you and affirm that walking your own Godordained path is what truly matters.

3.	Write a prayer asking God to free you from the bondage of comparison.







Prayer for Today

Lord Jesus, comparison has robbed me of peace for too long. Help me to stop looking at others and to find contentment in who You created me to be. Teach me to walk humbly in my own gifts and journey. Restore my heart from bitterness and jealousy. Fill me with Your joy and acceptance, grounding me firmly in Your love. Amen.

Day 3: **(**) Finding Healing in God's Love

Devotional: Unshakable Love That Heals Wounds

Galatians 5:1 "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 8:36 "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."
- 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."







Devotional: Freedom from the Slave Yoke of Comparison

Comparison can chain us in unhealthy patterns of self-doubt and pain. But Christ calls us to freedom. Galatians 5:1 exhorts believers not to be enslaved again by burdens like comparison and favoritism.

This freedom comes through Jesus' sacrifice and the Spirit's empowerment. Being free means no longer allowing past wounds or unhealthy thoughts to control your identity or emotions. Instead, you can live in power, love, and self-discipline—the Spirit's gifts that help you reject lies and embrace truth.

Reflect on the freedom Christ offers and take steps to break free from comparison's heavy yoke. Your life is meant for joy, not bondage.

Devotional: Building Relationships Rooted in Christlike Love

Healing from favoritism includes nurturing healthier, more loving relationships. Colossians 3 paints a picture of the attitudes God wants us to wear in our interactions: compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.

These qualities create an atmosphere where love grows and wounds steadily heal. Forgiveness and understanding become bridges instead of walls. Remember, healthy relationships don't mean perfection but a commitment to embody Christ's love with one another.

Today, focus on how you can cultivate these godly virtues in your closest relationships. Whether rebuilding with family or forming new bonds, Christ's love is your guiding light.

3.	In what ways does Christ's love model healthy relationships for you?

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2.	List ways you can show kindness and patience in your relationships.
3.	Pray for strength to embody God's love in difficult interactions.







Prayer for Today

Father God, help me clothe my heart and actions with Your compassion and kindness. Teach me humility and patience so I may build relationships rooted in Your love. Heal broken connections and guide me to foster peace and understanding. May Your love shine through me to others every day. Amen.

Supporting Scriptures

Devotional: Living Fully as God's New Creation
