Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 5:4 "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."
- Revelation 21:4 "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying or pain."







Devotional: God's Nearness in Brokenness

Grief is a natural response to loss and pain. The Bible does not shy away from acknowledging our sorrow. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God is especially near when our hearts feel broken and spirits crushed. It's comforting to know that grief is not something to hide or suppress; rather, it's a season where God's presence becomes more tangible.

Accepting grief helps us to face our feelings honestly. When mourning is embraced, God promises comfort and healing. Jesus taught that those who mourn are blessed because their sorrow opens the door to divine consolation. This shows us that grief is an important part of the healing process and spiritual maturity.

Through this study, begin by opening your heart to God's nearness during your broken moments. Let yourself acknowledge any wounds or broken relationships needing attention. Remember, God sees the pain and walks with you gently, ready to save and restore.

3.	Record a prayer asking God to reveal His comforting presence in your sorrow.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for being close to me in moments when my heart feels broken and my spirit crushed. Help me to embrace my grief, not as a sign of weakness but as a pathway to Your comfort and healing. Please open my eyes to any relationships needing reconciliation and give me courage to face these with grace. Your Verse

Ephesians 4:31–32 – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger... Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 12:15 "See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many."
- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone."







Devotional: Uprooting Bitterness Through Forgiveness

We often carry old wounds that fester beneath the surface—bitterness, anger, unspoken hurts—that block healing and reconciliation. These feelings can poison relationships and rob us of peace if left unaddressed. Ephesians 4:31–32 challenges believers to let go of negative emotions and replace them with kindness and forgiveness, just as God freely forgave us through Christ.

Unhealed wounds manifest as bitterness and root deeply, sometimes spreading hurt beyond the initial breach. Hebrews warns about the dangers of such bitterness taking root, causing defilement not only to ourselves but to many around us. The call is clear: examine your heart for these painful seeds and uproot them by God's power.

Forgiveness, though difficult, is transformative. It frees both the offender and the one offended. Today, reflect on any bitterness or rage you may be nurturing. Ask God to reveal these areas and to empower you to pursue forgiveness and restoration.







Reflect and Apply

	Are there bitterness or grudges you are holding onto that prevent healing?
2.	What prevents you from forgiving others as God forgives you?
	How might holding onto anger affect your relationships and spiritual walk?







Journaling Prompts

1.	List any past hurts or conflicts where bitterness still lingers.
2.	Write a letter (not necessarily to send) expressing your feelings about a difficult relationship.
3.	Pray for God's strength to forgive and release any anger in your heart.







Prayer for Today

Father, I ask You to search my heart and reveal any bitterness or anger I am holding onto. Help me to lay down these heavy burdens and embrace Your forgiveness. Teach me to forgive others as You have forgiven me. Remove any root of bitterness that causes harm to my soul and relationships. Restore kindness and compassion within me. Thank You for Your grace that heals and frees. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*















Your Verse

Matthew 5:23-24 - "...leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 12:18 "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone."
- 2 Corinthians 5:18 "All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation."







Devotional: Courageously Seek Peace with Others

Reconciliation requires intentional courage. Jesus teaches us the priority of mending broken relationships before offering worship. This radical call reminds us that peace with others is integral to our relationship with God.

Pursuing reconciliation may involve humbling ourselves, initiating difficult conversations, or offering genuine apologies. Romans 12:18 encourages believers to strive for peace with everyone—recognizing that while reconciliation is not always guaranteed, we must do our part.

We are also given a powerful identity: ambassadors of reconciliation. God's heart is to bring healing and restoration. Today, ask God how He might be calling you to reach out and restore a relationship before it's too late. Trust in His strength; He equips the willing.

1.	Are there relationships God is prompting you to reconcile?
2.	What fears or obstacles hold you back from making the first move?
3.	How does knowing you are God's ambassador of reconciliation inspire you?







Journaling Prompts

	Identify one relationship needing reconciliation and list steps you might take.
2.	Write about what forgiveness and peace mean to you personally.
	Pray for courage and wisdom to approach reconciliation honestly and humbly.







Prayer for Today

Dear Lord, thank You for calling me to live at peace with others and to be an ambassador of reconciliation. Help me to act courageously in reaching out where there is brokenness. Calm any fears or doubts that hinder me from pursuing harmony. Equip me with humility and grace to mend relationships in Your name. Your Verse

Luke 6:37 - "Forgive, and you will be forgiven."

Supporting Scriptures

- Mark 11:25 "Forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father in heaven may forgive your sins."
- Psalm 103:12 "As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us."







Devotional: The Freedom Found in Forgiveness

Forgiveness is a powerful pathway to healing. Jesus commands us simply, "Forgive, and you will be forgiven." This reciprocity is not about earning God's forgiveness but demonstrating a heart transformed by His grace.

Forgiving does not mean condoning hurtful actions or forgetting pain but releasing the hold of bitterness. It breaks chains that bind the soul and opens room for God's peace to flood in. Mark 11:25 links the act of forgiving others directly to our own forgiveness before God, making forgiveness a pivotal spiritual practice.

Psalm 103 poetically captures the completeness of God's forgiveness—removing our sins as far as east is from west. Embracing this divine forgiveness empowers us to extend grace to others, including those with whom we seek reconciliation.

1.	What does forgiveness mean to you in your current season of grief?
2.	How might forgiveness lead to your own healing and peace?
3.	Are there areas where you struggle to forgive? Why?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about someone you find hard to forgive and why.
2.	Reflect on God's forgiveness toward you—how does it affect your heart?
3.	Pray for the ability to extend forgiveness even when it feels difficult.







Prayer for Today

Gracious Father, Your forgiveness amazes me and frees me. Help me to forgive those who have hurt me, releasing bitterness and anger. Teach me to walk in Your grace daily, remembering Your mercy toward me. Let my heart be softened and healed through forgiveness, bringing peace to my soul and restoration in relationships. Day 5: SFinding Peace in God's Presence

Devotional: Anchoring in God's Peace Amid Anxiety

In your journey of healing, anchor your heart in God's peace. Let prayer replace anxiety, and faith guard your emotions. This divine peace strengthens the soul to face difficult conversations and release old burdens.

Devotional: Love: The Key to True Restoration
