Healing Hearts: A 21-Day Journey Through Childhood Depression



Explore God's word for comfort, hope, and strength as we address depression in children through scripture and prayer over 21 days.





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Introduction

Welcome to this 21-day Bible study on Mental Health, focusing specifically on Depression in Children. Depression in children is a deeply challenging and often misunderstood condition that touches many lives. It brings feelings of sadness, loneliness, and despair, even in the youngest hearts. As you spend time in this study, approach it with an open heart, inviting the Holy Spirit to minister peace, hope, and restoration.

Remember, depression is complex and sometimes professional help is needed alongside spiritual care. This study complements, rather than replaces, mental health support. May the Lord use these passages and







reflections to shine His light on each child's path, reminding us that no darkness is too deep for His love to reach. Let us begin this tender journey with faith and compassion.

Devotional: God's Comfort in Broken Hearts

When a child feels overwhelmed by sadness or despair, it can be heartbreaking for everyone involved. God's nearness brings comfort that transcends human understanding.
