#### Devotional: Opening Your Heart to Healing

Bitterness often begins silently, like a root growing deep within our hearts. Sometimes it takes time before we even realize it's there, disrupting our peace and relationships. Hebrews 12:15 warns us about the dangers of allowing bitterness to take root because it can cause trouble and defile many beyond ourselves.

Today, begin by recognizing bitterness within your own heart. It can manifest as anger, resentment, unforgiveness, or internal bitterness toward someone or a situation. This is not about guilt but awareness. Awareness is the first step to recovery.

Ask God to bring to light any bitterness hiding in your heart. Pray for the courage to face it honestly and the willingness to surrender it. God is gracious and ready to help you uproot bitterness and replace it with peace. Remember, God's grace is greater than any bitterness we carry.

#### Devotional: The Freedom of Forgiveness
