Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."







Devotional: God Is Near the Brokenhearted

Depression often steals the sense of connection, making us feel isolated and alone. Yet, God's Word reminds us He is near. Psalm 34:18 declares that the Lord is "close to the brokenhearted" and rescues those feeling crushed. Though your burden feels heavy, you are not forgotten.

God's presence is a refuge. As Isaiah 41:10 assures, He urges us not to fear because He is with us. This promise offers a firm foundation to stand on when anxiety and despair rise. Jesus invites the weary to find rest in Him (Matthew 11:28). Lean into this invitation today.

Let today be about acknowledging God's nearness. Even if you don't feel it, trust that He is with you in every moment of pain. Sit quietly, breathe deeply, and open your heart to His comforting presence.

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:13 "I can do all this through him who gives me strength."
- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







Devotional: God's Grace Perfects Our Weakness

When depression drains your energy and hope, God's strength becomes your lifeline. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12:9 remind us that God's grace is enough, especially in our weakness. Instead of hiding or denying your struggles, God's power is displayed most clearly when you rely on Him fully.

Allow Jesus' strength to fill your weaknesses. Philippians 4:13 echoes that we can do all things—not by our own might—but through the strength He provides. Depression makes us feel weak and small, but God's Spirit renews and empowers you each day.

Take comfort in Isaiah 40:29. God increases the power of those who feel worn down. Today, surrender your exhaustion to Him and ask for a fresh infusion of strength to keep moving forward.

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 42:11 "Why, my soul, are you downcast? Put your hope in God."
- Lamentations 3:22–23 "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning."







Day 3: W Hope Beyond the Darkness

Devotional: Trust God to Renew Your Hope

Depression can feel like an endless night, but God's Word offers a steadfast hope—a promise of joy and peace. Romans 15:13 prays for God to fill us with hope as we trust Him, reminding us that hope is not wishful thinking but a confident expectation anchored in God's faithfulness.

Even when your soul is downcast, Psalm 42:11 encourages you to redirect your hope toward God. Hope reignites your spirit and lifts your heart from despair.

Remember Lamentations 3:22–23. God's compassion never fails—they are fresh every morning. This means no matter how dark today feels, tomorrow offers new mercy and the chance to begin again in His grace.

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 61:1 "He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted."
- Joel 2:25 "I will restore to you the years that the locust has eaten."







Devotional: Healing Begins with God's Restoration

Recovery from depression often begins in brokenness. It is painful, but it's the soil where healing and growth take root. Psalm 147:3 reminds us that God is intimately aware of our pain, actively healing and binding our wounds.

Isaiah 61:1 further reveals God's mission to bring comfort to the brokenhearted. You aren't broken beyond repair; God is the master restorer, turning your shattered pieces into something renewed.

God's promise in Joel 2:25 assures restoration even of the time and vitality depression has taken from your life. Trust in this hope — the recovery process is real and imbued with divine purpose.

What hopes do you hold for the years you feel lost or wasted?

- Psalm 103:11 "For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him."
- Jeremiah 31:3 "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness."







Devotional: Unchanging Love in Every Season

Depression can distort self-worth and make you feel unloved or forgotten. But God's love is unshakable, infinite, and unconditional. Romans 8:38–39

powerfully declares that absolutely nothing can separate us from God's love—not even the darkest moments of life.

Psalm 103:11 expresses the vastness of God's love, as high as the heavens from the earth. Imagine that height and depth stretching toward you today—there's no place too low or unworthy.

Jeremiah 31:3 reminds us of God's everlasting and unfailing kindness. He draws you close even when you feel distant. Rest in the certainty of this love, allowing it to anchor your soul through recovery.

How has feeling loved by God affected your healing process?
What doubts about God's love do you need to surrender?
How can the truths on God's love reshape your view of yourself?

Your Verse

Psalm 46:1 - "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 18:10 "The name of the Lord is a fortified tower; the righteous run to it and are safe."
- Nahum 1:7 "The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble."







Devotional: Find Safety and Strength in God

In the storms of depression, we need a safe place to hide and regain strength. Psalm 46:1 invites us to see God as our refuge, ever-present and reliable.

Proverbs 18:10 portrays God's name as a fortified tower. Whenever fear or despair threaten, running to God provides safety and protection. There is no shame in seeking refuge; it is wise and life-giving.

Nahum 1:7 confirms the Lord's goodness. His refuge is not only a place of safety but also a reminder that God cares deeply and acts on our behalf. Today, retreat to this refuge in prayer and confidence.

Devotional: God Tenderly Holds Your Tears

Depression often brings tears—visible or hidden—that communicate deep pain. Psalm 56:8 comforts us by revealing that God does not overlook these tears. He collects them, treasuring every sorrow as deeply significant.

God's care culminates in the future hope of Revelation 21:4, where every tear is wiped away, and suffering ends.

Isaiah 41:10 offers assurance that God strengthens and supports us in our struggles. Allow yourself to cry and lay down your burdens in prayer, knowing God is listening with compassion and ready to uphold you.

Devotional: Transform Your Mind Through God's Truth

Depression often distorts our thinking—clouding truth with negativity and hopelessness. Romans 12:2 encourages transformation through renewing our minds by God's truth.

Philippians 4:8 invites us to fix our thoughts on good and pure things. By focusing on God's promises rather than lies, you open space for healing and peace.

Isaiah's promise in 26:3 states that steady, focused minds enjoy God's perfect peace. Take intentional steps today to replace harmful thoughts with Scripture and praise, allowing God to renew your mental and spiritual health.

Devotional: Trusting God's Good Plans for You

It is easy to feel lost or uncertain during depression, questioning if good lies ahead. God's word through Jeremiah assures us He has good plans for our future: plans filled with hope and prosperity.

Proverbs 3:5-6 calls us to trust God wholeheartedly. This trust allows Him to direct our path, assuring us even detours serve His purpose.

Romans 8:28 reminds us that God works all things—even hardship—for our ultimate good. Allow this truth to soften fear about the unknown and deepen your trust in recovery's unfolding.
