Devotional: From Blindness to God's Glory

Today, we meet a man who has lived in darkness since birth—both literal and symbolic. Jesus and His disciples pass by, and the disciples ask, "Who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" This question reflects a common belief then and sometimes even now—that suffering is always a direct result of sin. But Jesus gives a different perspective: this man's blindness exists "so that the works of God might be displayed in him." This teaches us that affliction can be an opportunity for God's glory, not necessarily a punishment.

Consider how Jesus notices the man, focusing compassion and attention on the marginalized. His approach is full of purpose, signaling that no suffering or person is invisible to God's care. He uses the man's condition to reveal something greater about Himself and God's power.

Let this truth resonate today: our challenges or limitations can be moments where God's power is made manifest. Our understanding of circumstances must shift from blame and despair to possibility and faith.

Jesus meets people where they are, using what's immediately available to initiate healing.

This gesture reminds us that God's interventions often come through accessible, relatable means—not always grand or remote miracles, but personal touch and presence. It also symbolizes how spiritual healing can begin through unexpected methods and divine creativity. The mud, created from earth and the living Son's saliva, combines the created world with divine power.

Healing is not only about spectacle but about relationship—the closeness Jesus shows invites trust and participation.

Today, reflect on how God might be using simple, everyday moments to bring healing and restoration in your life. Are you open to receiving His touch, even if it's in unexpected ways?

Obedience often requires trust, especially when God's commands seem unusual or inconvenient. Yet, it unlocks doors to transformation and blessing. The man's willingness to act without seeing the outcome reflects a heart open to God's work. It reminds us that faith often requires walking forward in belief before seeing tangible results.

Devotional: When Hard Hearts Refuse the Light

The Pharisees enter the story with suspicion and disbelief. Their theological presupposition that Jesus is a sinner blinds them to the miracle. They focus on the how, missing the who—the healing power of God at work in Jesus. Their questioning reveals hardness of heart and resistance to change.

This tension between spiritual blindness and physical sight stands at the core of this passage. The religious leaders, despite their knowledge of Scripture, are unable to perceive the truth because of pride and preconceived notions. This warns us that knowledge alone does not ensure spiritual insight.

Reflect on your attitudes toward God's work, especially when it challenges your expectations. Are there areas where skepticism or tradition blocks your openness? Ask God to grant you humility to seek truth with a teachable heart.

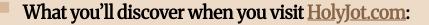




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
