Devotional: God's Nearness in Our Brokenness

Eating disorders can leave a man feeling isolated, broken, and overwhelmed by shame. Yet, God is not distant from our pain. Psalm 34:18 powerfully reminds us that the Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves those crushed in spirit. This promise speaks directly to anyone wrestling with mental and emotional distress caused by eating disorders.

Often, men face cultural pressures to appear strong, hiding their struggles behind a mask. But God's Word assures us that vulnerability is not weakness. Jesus invites the weary and burdened to come to Him for rest (Matthew 11:28), offering a refuge for minds and hearts that are heavy.

God's compassion is a healing balm for our minds and spirits. No matter how deep the struggle or the shame, He desires to meet us in the broken places and restore hope. Today, open your heart to His presence, trusting that you do not carry your burdens alone.

- Philippians 4:8 NIV "Whatever is true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable—think about such things."







Day 2: Nenewing the Mind Against Lies

Devotional: Transforming Thoughts Through God's Truth

Eating disorders often come with a barrage of negative and harmful thoughts that distort reality and damage self-image. Romans 12:2 urges us not to conform to the worldly mindset but to allow God to renew our minds. This renewal is essential in battling the lies that fuel unhealthy habits.

God calls us to take every thought captive (2 Corinthians 10:5), making them obedient to Christ's truth rather than the lies of shame, perfectionism, or control that eating disorders promote.

Renewing your mind is an ongoing, active process requiring God's help and your intentional focus on what is true and good. Philippians 4:8 encourages us to dwell on noble and praiseworthy things instead of destructive doubts. By inviting God's truth to reshape your thinking, you create space for healing and freedom.

Reflect and Apply

What negative thoughts do you often struggle with related to your eating disorder?
How can you practice taking these thoughts captive and replacing them with God's truth?
In what ways does focusing on what is true and admirable help your mental health?

Journaling Prompts

Identify three common lies you tell yourself and write God's truths to counter them.
Describe how your thoughts affect your emotions and behaviors around food and self-image.
Write a prayer asking God to renew your mind in the areas you most struggle with.







Day 2: Nenewing the Mind Against Lies

Prayer for Today

Lord, help me to renew my mind and reject the lies that fuel my struggles.

Teach me to focus on Your truth and to take captive every thought that hurts me. Fill my mind with what is pure and lovely, and transform my inner world by Your grace. I surrender my thoughts to You today. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

Galatians 6:2 NIV – "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ."

Supporting Scriptures

- Ecclesiastes 4:9–10 NIV "Two are better than one... If either of them falls down, one can help the other up."
- James 5:16 NIV "Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed."







Devotional: Healing Through Honest Connection

Men struggling with eating disorders often feel isolated and may fear judgment for their vulnerability. Yet Scripture calls us toward community and support as vital components of healing.

Galatians 6:2 teaches us to carry one another's burdens, showing that walking through mental health struggles does not have to be a solitary fight. Ecclesiastes reminds us of the strength found in companionship—the power to help one another up when we fall.

Confessing struggles and praying together, as encouraged in James 5:16, opens pathways to healing not only spiritually but emotionally and mentally. Vulnerability is not weakness but a courageous step toward freedom. Surround yourself with trusted individuals who can encourage and walk alongside you through recovery.

What fears or barriers keep you from seeking support and vulnerability?
How might carrying each other's burdens impact your healing journey?

Devotional: Embracing Your New Identity in Christ

Eating disorders can distort how we see ourselves, often linking self-worth to appearance or control. God offers a fresh identity rooted in who He created us to be.

2 Corinthians 5:17 reminds us that through Christ, we are new creations—our past struggles do not define us. Ephesians 2:10 emphasizes that we are God's masterpiece, intentionally made for a purpose.

Psalm 139 beautifully affirms our unique and wonderful design in God's eyes. Embracing this identity frees us from the lies that fuel disordered behaviors and restores our value and dignity. *Today, choose to anchor your identity in Christ's love rather than in external appearances or control.*







Reflect and Apply

1.	How does your current self-image compare to how God sees you?
2.	What aspects of your identity do you need to surrender to Jesus?
	How can embracing your God-given worth influence your healing process?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write a letter to yourself from God's perspective, highlighting His love and purpose for you.
2.	Describe ways your identity in Christ can replace unhealthy beliefs about yourself.
3.	Reflect on the 'old' parts of your story you want to release and the 'new' you want to embrace.







Prayer for Today

Lord, thank You for making me a new creation in Christ. Help me to see myself as You see me—fearfully and wonderfully made. Devotional: Embracing God's Peace and Hope Daily

As we conclude this study, remember that healing is a daily journey marked by God's peace and hope. Philippians encourages us to bring all anxieties to God through prayer. When we do, His peace, beyond human understanding, guards our hearts and minds as we walk in recovery.

Hope in the Lord renews our strength (Isaiah 40:31), empowering us to keep moving forward even on difficult days. God's plans for us are good—they are full of hope and a future (Jeremiah 29:11).

Cling to these promises, knowing that mental health struggles, including eating disorders, do not define your destiny. With God's guidance and peace, you can experience ongoing healing and freedom.

3.	What hopes do you hold for your future with God's help?

3.	List specific ways you can renew your hope and strength in Christ.
