#### Devotional: God Draws Near to Your Broken Heart

#### Devotional: Embracing God's Supernatural Peace Today

Anxiety is often a companion to mental health struggles and can be intensified by generational trauma. Yet Jesus offers a peace unlike anything the world provides. John 14:27 assures us His peace is a divine gift, calming our restless hearts in the midst of storms.

Philippians 4:6-7 encourages us to bring our worries to God in prayer, promising that His peace will guard our hearts and minds. This peace transcends human understanding—it is supernatural and sustaining. Psalm 46:10 invites us to pause, be still, and recognize God's sovereign presence.

When anxious thoughts arise, leaning into God's peace can anchor us. This requires intentional moments of stillness and trust, especially when overwhelming feelings remind us of lingering trauma. God longs to steady your mind and heart; His peace is within reach at every moment.

#### Devotional: Stand Firm with God's Protective Armor

The mind is a battlefield, especially for those affected by generational trauma and mental health challenges. Ephesians 6:11 instructs us to put on God's full armor—spiritual protection that shields us from negative and destructive forces.

2 Corinthians 10:5 reminds us of our authority in Christ to take every thought captive, making them obedient to Him. This active defense is essential to guard mental health against lies and fears inherited through trauma.

Psalm 91 offers beautiful imagery of God's sheltering protection. Dwelling in His presence brings safety and rest, even when mental attacks arise. Using God's armor daily equips us to stand firm and reject anything that tries to steal our peace or distort our mind.

#### Devotional: Embrace God's Healing Love Fully

Healing mental health wounds, especially those passed down through generations, requires the tender touch of God's love. Jeremiah 30:17 promises restoration and healing, a divine commitment to make us whole again.

Psalm 147:3 offers the comforting image of God binding our broken hearts and wounds with His healing hands. This healing is both emotional and spiritual, addressing the roots of trauma that affect us deeply.

1 John 4:16 tells us that God is love itself. Living in this love renews our identity and fills the void left by pain and fear. Receiving God's love invites transformation and enables us to extend grace and forgiveness—to ourselves and others, breaking cycles of trauma and despair.
