#### Your Verse

Ephesians 4:31 – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Hebrews 12:15 "See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many."
- Proverbs 14:10 "Each heart knows its own bitterness, and no one else can share its joy."







#### Devotional: Recognizing Bitterness's Hidden Power

Bitterness is a root issue that harms our relationships deeply. Ephesians 4:31 commands us to "get rid of all bitterness," signaling its destructive effects not only on our hearts but also within community. Bitterness may start from small offenses or major wounds, but unchecked it grows, contaminating joy and trust among us.

The warning in Hebrews 12:15 about bitter roots causing trouble reminds us that bitterness does not stay isolated—it spreads hurt like poison affecting many people around us. Yet, bitterness is often hidden, even within ourselves, which Proverbs 14:10 highlights by stating only the heart fully knows its own bitterness.

Today, reflect deeply on your heart's condition. Are there past hurts or grudges you are still carrying? Bitterness may feel justified, but God calls us to release it for our own healing and the flourishing of our community. Let this day be a moment of honest self-examination and the start of intentional letting go.

Day 2: When The Call to Forgiveness

#### Your Verse

Colossians 3:13 - "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."
- Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."







Day 2: W The Call to Forgiveness

#### Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness to Overcome Bitterness

**Forgiveness is God's remedy for bitterness.** Colossians 3:13 encourages mutual forgiveness as an active commitment—it's not optional but essential for community health. It reminds us that we forgive because we have been forgiven first by the Lord, setting the bar for how mercy should flow among us.

Jesus emphasized this principle in Matthew 6:14, highlighting the relationship between the forgiveness we extend and the forgiveness we receive. This divine cycle breaks the chains of bitterness and opens pathways to healing.

Paul further exhorts us in Ephesians 4:32 to be kind and compassionate, renewing how we relate to others through forgiveness rooted in Christ's example. Forgiveness does not minimize offense but actively releases the offender and the offended from the burden of pain.

Ask God to empower you today to forgive deeply. It may not be easy and might take time, but choosing forgiveness aligns your heart with God's healing plan.

#### Devotional: Allowing God to Heal Your Heart

Bitterness often grows from deep wounds and unresolved pain. Psalm 147:3 offers a beautiful promise—God Himself is the healer of the brokenhearted, tenderly binding our wounds with His love. Healing is both a divine gift and a process that involves trusting God's presence and timing.

Isaiah 41:10 reminds us that we are not alone amid our pain. God's strength and support are constantly available to uphold us during difficult seasons.

Jeremiah 30:17 encourages hope that restoration and health are possible. God's healing penetrates beyond the surface, mending the root of bitterness and restoring joy and peace.

Allow yourself to bring your hurts before God today. Invite Him to begin the healing work in your heart and community relationships, trusting that His loving care can transform wounds into testimony of grace.

#### Devotional: Relying on God's Grace in Weakness

Grace is the key to breaking the cycle of bitterness and resentment. In 2 Corinthians 12:9, God reveals that His grace is sufficient regardless of our weaknesses and shortcomings. Bitterness can thrive when we rely on our own strength to manage pain, but God's power is displayed most vividly when we surrender.

Romans 5:20 reminds us that as sin tries to increase, God's grace overflows even more abundantly, ensuring restoration is always possible.

John 1:16 encourages us to receive continuously the blessings from God's fullness of grace, which empowers love, forgiveness, and patience in relationships.

Today, lean into God's grace with humility. Accept that healing and letting go of bitterness is a process fueled by His power, not your own will alone.

#### Devotional: Courageous, Loving Communication Restores Hearts

Healthy relationships thrive on honest communication wrapped in love.

Ephesians 4:15 encourages us to speak truth in love for the growth and maturity of the body of Christ. Bitterness often festers when truth is avoided or expressed harshly.

Proverbs 27:5 tells us that open correction, though sometimes uncomfortable, is better than hidden love that allows damage to grow unnoticed.

James 1:19 provides valuable guidance on communication—listening carefully, controlling our words, and managing anger help create a safe space for reconciliation.

Consider how you can practice truthful, loving dialogue today. What conversations need courage and grace to help release bitterness and restore unity?

Amen.
