# Healing Relationships: Overcoming Offense Biblically

Ephesians 4:31 – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice."

- Proverbs 19:11 "A person's wisdom yields patience; it is to one's glory to overlook an offense."
- Matthew 18:15 "If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you."







### Devotional: Identifying Offense to Begin Healing

Offense often sneaks in quietly but leaves loud echoes in our hearts. When someone wrongs us, it can stir feelings from mild irritation to deep hurt. Recognizing offense is the first step toward healing because unaddressed offense breeds bitterness, which can poison our spirits and relationships. The apostle Paul instructs us to get rid of bitterness and anger — emotions that tether us to pain and block God's peace.

It's important to understand that being offended isn't a sin by itself; it's a natural emotional response. What matters most is how we respond. Wisdom teaches us patience and encourages overlooking minor offenses rather than reacting impulsively. Yet, serious offenses require confrontation and communication to restore relationship health.

Today, reflect on the offenses you carry. Are there any feelings of bitterness or anger you need to surrender? God invites you to release these burdens to Him and take the first step towards peace.

## **Journaling Prompts**

### Prayer for Today

Day 2: Vunderstanding God's Heart on Offense

#### Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 – "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Luke 6:37 "Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven."
- Romans 12:19 "Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath."







Day 2: Vunderstanding God's Heart on Offense

### Devotional: Embracing God's Compassion for Offense

God understands the pain offense causes — He is near to the brokenhearted. When offenses wound us, it's comforting to know that God is not distant or indifferent but intimately involved in our healing. His heart beats for restoration and forgiveness, calling us to mirror His mercy.

Jesus teaches us not to judge or condemn, but to forgive as we have been forgiven. Forgiveness is not always easy or immediate, but it frees us from the prison of bitterness. When we choose to forgive and refrain from revenge, we give God room to work justice and reconciliation.

Consider today how God's compassion can reshape your response to offense. Trust that He is walking alongside you, ready to heal your brokenness and guide you toward peace.

### Prayer for Today

Merciful Father, thank You for drawing near to me in my pain. Help me to experience Your healing touch and to forgive others as You have forgiven me. Teach me to release judgment and bitterness, trusting You to right every wrong in Your perfect timing. Fill my heart with Your peace and compassion, that I may be a vessel of Your love. *In Jesus' name, Amen.* 















#### Your Verse

Proverbs 15:1 - "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- James 1:19 "Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry,"
- Ephesians 4:29 "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up."







### Devotional: Communicating with Grace Amid Offense

How we communicate about offense can either open doors for healing or deepen wounds. The Bible highlights the importance of gentle and truthful words. A harsh reply can escalate anger, while a calm and loving response can defuse tension and create space for reconciliation.

James reminds us to listen carefully, control our speech, and guard against quick anger. When discussing offense, it's vital to speak with grace, focusing not on blame but on understanding and restoration. Using unwholesome or hurtful words only adds damage.

Today, ask God to guide your words as you navigate offenses in your relationships. Practice patience and seek to build up rather than tear down.

2.	What role does listening play when addressing offense?
3.	Where might you need to control anger to speak more gently?







## **Journaling Prompts**

	Recall a conversation about offense where words helped heal. What made it successful?
2.	Write down phrases you could use to speak gently in difficult moments.
3.	Reflect on how you can be a better listener in tense situations.







## **Prayer for Today**

Lord, guide my speech to reflect Your love and grace. Teach me to listen deeply and respond gently, especially when I feel offended. Help me to avoid harsh words and to build others up even in times of conflict. Grant me patience and wisdom to handle sensitive conversations with Your Spirit's help. *In Jesus' name, Amen.* 















#### Your Verse

Colossians 3:13 – "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."
- Mark 11:25 "When you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."







#### Devotional: Forgiveness as Freedom from Offense

Forgiveness is the key to unlocking freedom from offense and bitterness. God commands us to forgive others as He has forgiven us, even when it feels difficult or undeserved. Holding grudges traps us in pain and blocks God's peace in our hearts.

Forgiving doesn't mean forgetting or excusing hurt but releasing the right to revenge and choosing to restore relationship where possible. It's ultimately an act of obedience and trust in God's justice and grace. Scripture reminds us that our own forgiveness from God is connected to our forgiveness of others.

Today, reflect on places where forgiveness is needed in your life and lean into God's power to forgive. Experience the freedom and peace that come from this essential biblical principle.







## Reflect and Apply

1.	Are there people you need to forgive to find peace?
2.	How does God's forgiveness empower you to forgive others?
3.	What fears or obstacles make forgiveness challenging for you?







## **Journaling Prompts**

1.	Write down the names of those you need to forgive and pray over each.
2.	Describe how holding onto offense has affected your life negatively.
	Reflect on what it would mean to experience full forgiveness in your heart.







### Prayer for Today

**Jesus, thank You for forgiving me so fully.** Help me to forgive those who have offended me, releasing any bitterness or desire for revenge. Fill me with Your strength and grace to forgive even when it is hard. I choose to trust Your justice and embrace the freedom of forgiveness. *In Your name I pray, Amen.* 



















Day 5: Rebuilding Trust and Reconciliation

#### Your Verse

Matthew 5:23-24 - "If you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift... first go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Romans 12:18 "If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone."
- 2 Corinthians 5:18 "All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation."







Day 5: Rebuilding Trust and Reconciliation

# Devotional: Taking Steps Toward Peace and Restoration

Offense can fracture relationships, but God calls us to take the initiative toward reconciliation. Jesus highlights that reconciliation with others is so important it takes priority even before worship. This shows how seriously God values peace and unity in relationships.

Rebuilding trust is often a process requiring humility, honest communication, and time. Sometimes it takes courageous steps to extend grace and say, "Let's work toward peace." We also recognize that reconciliation is a ministry God entrusts to us as His followers.

Today, pray for the courage to pursue peace and for God to heal broken places in your relationships. Remember that, as we reconcile with others, we mirror the amazing reconciliation God offers us through Christ.

## **Prayer for Today**

Father, thank You for reconciling me to Yourself through Jesus. Help me to be an agent of Your peace by seeking reconciliation where there is offense. Give me courage, humility, and wisdom to rebuild trust and restore relationships. May Your love flow through me as I take these steps toward healing. *In Jesus'* name, Amen.















#### Your Verse

Hebrews 12:15 - "See to it that no one falls short of the grace of God and that no bitter root grows up to cause trouble and defile many."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Proverbs 4:23 "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it."
- Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."







#### Devotional: Guarding Your Heart from Bitterness

Once offended, it's possible for bitterness to take root in our hearts and cause ongoing damage. The author of Hebrews warns us to guard against a 'bitter root' that defiles not just ourselves but also those around us. Protecting your heart means regularly checking in on your emotional and spiritual wellbeing and addressing offense before it grows into resentment.

Proverbs advises us to guard our hearts carefully because our actions and attitudes flow from what is inside. Practicing kindness and compassion, paired with forgiveness, strengthens us against bitterness and helps maintain health in relationships.

Today, evaluate your heart's condition. Are there areas vulnerable to resentment that need God's healing and protection?







## Reflect and Apply

	How vigilant are you in protecting your heart from offense turning into bitterness?
2.	What daily habits can help you guard your heart effectively?
3.	In what ways does kindness help prevent resentment?







## **Journaling Prompts**

1.	Identify any 'bitter roots' you sense growing in your heart right now.
2.	List positive practices you can adopt to guard against bitterness.
3.	Reflect on God's grace as a healing balm for wounded hearts.







### Prayer for Today

**Lord, help me to guard my heart diligently.** Remove any bitterness or resentment that seeks to take root in me. Fill me with Your kindness and compassion so that I may reflect Your love in all my relationships. Strengthen me to walk daily in forgiveness and grace. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

#### Your Verse

1 Corinthians 13:4–7 – "Love is patient, love is kind... It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- John 13:34 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another."
- Galatians 5:22–23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness..."







Day 7: B Living Out Love in Every Relationship

#### Devotional: Embodying Christ's Love in Relationships

Ultimately, healing and overcoming offense flow out of a heart rooted in love.

Paul describes love as patient and kind — qualities that counteract offense and build strong, enduring relationships. Jesus commands us to love one another just as He has loved us, setting the highest example of selfless love.

The fruit of the Spirit includes love and peace, ingredients for healthy interactions even when offenses try to disrupt us. Living out this love requires daily reliance on the Holy Spirit, intentionality, and humility.

As you conclude this study, commit to living out love in all your relationships, trusting God to empower you to overcome offense with grace. Your relationships will flourish as you reflect Christ's love and forgiveness.
