Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day Bible study focused on mental health, specifically addressing the deep wounds caused by spiritual abuse trauma. Spiritual abuse can leave lasting scars—feelings of shame, confusion, fear, and broken trust in God and others. Yet, God's Word offers profound hope and restoration for those who suffer.

This study is designed to gently guide you toward healing by exploring Scripture passages that reveal God's compassion for the hurting mind and heart. Each day, you will engage with truths about God's nature, His desire for your wholeness, and how the Holy Spirit works to renew your thoughts and emotions.

Mental health struggles often feel isolating, especially when compounded by past spiritual abuse. But **you are not alone**. God sees your pain, understands your history, and invites you into a safe restoration process. As you meditate on these passages, we encourage you to journal honestly, pray vulnerably, and reflect deeply on God's promises.

Over the coming week, you will find scriptures on God's peace, His corrective love without condemnation, and His power to bring beauty from brokenness. Healing is a journey—not a quick fix—and by connecting God's Word with your experience, you can take steps toward renewed mental and emotional well-being.







Let this time be a sacred space where God's truth replaces lies from your past and His kindness comforts your wounded soul. May you emerge from this study with fresh courage and hope as you walk toward freedom in Christ.

















Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- Isaiah 61:1 "...to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives..."







Devotional: God Draws Near to Broken Hearts

Spiritual abuse leaves invisible wounds in the heart and mind. These wounds may manifest as shame, fear, confusion, or feeling spiritually disconnected. Psalm 34:18 reassures us that God is especially near when we are brokenhearted. He does not hide or turn away but draws close, offering salvation and comfort.

The healing process begins by acknowledging the pain and naming the wounds. Denying or minimizing them often prolongs suffering. God's heart for you is tender and compassionate. He is the great healer who sees your invisible scars and longs to bind them up (Psalm 147:3).

Recognizing your trauma is the courageous first step toward healing. You are not weak or unfaithful; you are wounded—that's why God draws near. As you read Isaiah 61:1, reflect on God's proclaimed mission to bring freedom and restoration to captives and the brokenhearted.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What spiritual wounds have been left by your experiences of spiritual abuse?
2.	How does it affect your faith to know God is close to those who are brokenhearted?
	Are there ways you have tried to hide or deny your pain, and how might naming it bring healing?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about moments when you felt brokenhearted or crushed in spirit.
2.	Describe what it means to you that God wants to bind up your wounds.
3.	Consider ways you can invite God's presence into your pain today.







Prayer for Today

Lord, my heart feels heavy from wounds I cannot always see. Yet Your Word promises You are close to the brokenhearted and save those crushed in spirit. Help me to trust Your nearness even in my pain. Bring Your healing touch to my wounded heart. Teach me to rest in Your compassionate presence and find hope in Your care. Restore my spirit and renew my soul. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 - "Do not be anxious about anything... And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you... Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast..."







Day 2: Da

Devotional: Embracing God's Peace in Anxiety

Anxiety and fear are common after spiritual abuse, often filling the mind with restless doubt and confusion. Philippians 4:6–7 encourages us not to give in to anxiety, but rather to bring everything to God in prayer. When we do, *His peace* surpasses our understanding and guards our hearts and minds.

This peace is not dependent on external circumstances but arises from trusting God's sovereignty and presence. Jesus promised a peace that removes fear (John 14:27), and Isaiah reminds us that perfect peace comes when our minds focus firmly on God.

Choosing to entrust your anxieties to God can feel risky—especially when spiritual abuse has shaken your confidence in God and others. But God's peace is a powerful guard, protecting your heart and mind from the chaos of fear, heavy accusations, and guilt.

3.	List ways you can practice releasing anxiety to God regularly.

Father, anxiety often overwhelms my mind and spirit. Thank You for the promise of Your peace that guards my heart and mind. *Help me to bring my worries to You in prayer and trust You fully.* Calm my restless thoughts and replace fear with Your perfect peace. Sustain me through Your Spirit as I learn to lean on You. In Jesus' name, Amen.



















Day 3: ① God's Love Defends and Restores

Your Verse

Romans 8:38–39 – "Nothing can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 5:11 "But let all who take refuge in you be glad; let them ever sing for joy. Spread your protection over them..."
- Isaiah 54:17 "No weapon forged against you will prevail... It is the heritage of the servants of the LORD."







Day 3: ① God's Love Defends and Restores

Devotional: Unshakeable Love Guards Your Soul

One of the deepest wounds from spiritual abuse is feeling unworthy or unloved by God. This lie can cripple mental health by breeding despair and isolation. Yet Romans 8:38–39 powerfully declares that nothing—no trauma, no accusation, no shame—can separate us from God's love in Christ.

God's love is more than a feeling; it is a protective shield (Psalm 5:11) that defends and restores. No weapon, including the pain inflicted through spiritual abuse, can ultimately harm those He calls His own (Isaiah 54:17).

Receiving this truth takes time and intentionality. God's love confronts and overcomes the toxic messages you may have absorbed. It invites you into a secure identity as His beloved child, freed from condemnation, and empowered to heal.

Reflect and Apply

1.	What lies about God's love have you believed because of spiritual abuse?
2.	How does knowing nothing can separate you from God's love challenge those lies?
3.	What does it look like to find refuge and joy under God's protection?

Journaling Prompts

1.	Write down affirmations about your identity in God's love.
2.	Reflect on how God's love has shown up in your life recently.
3.	List areas where you need to surrender feelings of unworthiness to God.







Day 3: ① God's Love Defends and Restores

Prayer for Today

Dear God, I often feel distant and unlovable because of past wounds. Yet Your Word reminds me that nothing can separate me from Your love. *Help me to fully receive this truth and reject the lies of condemnation.* Spread Your protective love over my heart and renew my soul with Your healing power. Let me rest securely as Your beloved child. In Jesus' name, Amen.



















Day 4: 🍞 Renewal Through the Spirit

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 5:17 – "If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 12:2 "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind."
- Ezekiel 36:26 "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you..."







Day 4: 7 Renewal Through the Spirit

Devotional: Embracing New Life in Christ

Spiritual abuse can leave deep-rooted patterns of negative thinking and emotional harm. However, 2 Corinthians 5:17 reminds us that in Christ, we can become new creations. The broken old self does not have to define you forever.

The renewing of your mind (Romans 12:2) is essential in overcoming mental health challenges related to trauma. This transformation involves inviting the Holy Spirit to reframe your thoughts, replacing lies with God's truth.

God promises to give you a new heart and spirit (Ezekiel 36:26), a work that requires patience and grace. Healing includes practical spiritual disciplines—prayer, worship, Scripture meditation—but also the gentle acceptance of where you are today.

Reflect and Apply

1.	What old mindsets or emotions might God be calling you to release?
2.	How can you cooperate with the Spirit in renewing your mind?
3.	What does being a 'new creation' mean for your mental health journey?







Day 4: 🍞 Renewal Through the Spirit

Journaling Prompts

1.	Identify negative thoughts you wish to replace with God's truth.
2.	Describe ways you have experienced renewal in the past.
3.	Write a prayer inviting the Holy Spirit to renew your heart today.







Day 4: 7 Renewal Through the Spirit

Prayer for Today

Spirit of God, I long for renewal in my heart and mind. Thank You for making me a new creation in Christ. *Help me to release old hurts and patterns that no longer serve Your purpose.* Teach me to be transformed daily as I open myself to Your truth and healing. Fill me with Your new spirit and lead me in Your ways. In Jesus' name, Amen.



















Your Verse

Matthew 11:28-29 - "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 23:2-3 "He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul."
- Exodus 33:14 "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest."







Devotional: Finding True Rest in Jesus

Trauma from spiritual abuse can exhaust your mind and spirit, leaving you constantly burdened. Jesus' invitation in Matthew 11:28–29 is a gentle call to lay down your heavy burdens and receive His rest.

Rest is more than physical; it is spiritual and emotional renewal. Psalm 23 paints a vivid picture of God leading us to peaceful places that refresh the soul. Such rest brings clarity and healing for a weary mind.

When fear or trauma tempt you to keep striving and never pause, remember that God's presence Himself offers rest (Exodus 33:14). Accept God's invitation to rest as a vital step toward recovery.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What burdens are you carrying that affect your mental health?
2.	How can you respond to Jesus' invitation to find rest today?
3.	What barriers might prevent you from resting in God's presence?







Journaling Prompts

1.	List areas where you feel mentally or emotionally weary.
2.	Describe how God's rest looks or feels in your life.
3.	Plan practical ways to incorporate rest into your healing process.







Prayer for Today

Jesus, I come before You feeling weary and burdened. Thank You for Your promise to give rest to my soul. *Help me trust Your gentle invitation and receive the peace only You can provide*. Teach me to rest in Your presence and allow You to refresh my spirit. Renew my strength and calm my restless mind. In Your name, Amen.

















Your Verse

James 1:5 - "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him..."
- Psalm 119:105 "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."







Devotional: Seeking God's Wisdom in Healing

Living through trauma can make the path forward confusing and overwhelming. James 1:5 encourages us to ask God for wisdom—His guidance is always available and abundant.

Trusting God instead of your own understanding (Proverbs 3:5-6) is challenging but necessary, especially when past spiritual abuse has distorted your view of truth and safety.

God's Word acts as a light in the darkness (Psalm 119:105), helping you discern healthy choices, set boundaries, and seek support. Seek God's wisdom daily, knowing He desires to lead you safely through the shadows toward healing.







Reflect and Apply

1.	What decisions feel difficult or unclear because of past trauma?
2.	How can God's wisdom guide your mental health journey?
3.	In what ways can Scripture be your lamp in difficult moments?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write about a time you sensed God's guidance in confusion.
2.	Identify specific areas where you need wisdom and pray over them.
3.	Reflect on how you can better trust God instead of your own understanding.







Prayer for Today

God, I need Your wisdom to navigate the confusing emotions and memories. Thank You for Your promise to give generously without finding fault. *Help me to trust You fully and lean on Your Word as my guide.* Illuminate my path and provide clarity for my healing journey. Surround me with Your light and truth.

In Jesus' name, Amen.

- Lamentations 3:22–23 "Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

Devotional: Embracing God's Hope for Tomorrow

As this study concludes, focus on the hopeful promise God offers. Despite past trauma and mental health struggles, Jeremiah 29:11 assures us that God has good plans for your life—plans filled with hope and a future.

God is the God of hope (Romans 15:13), ready to fill you with joy and peace as you continue to trust Him. His mercy is new every morning (Lamentations 3:22–23), offering fresh grace for each step in healing.

Remember that your past does not define your destiny. God's faithfulness and love remain steadfast, inviting you to embrace new beginnings filled with restoration, purpose, and peace.

2.	How can you hold onto God's promises when healing feels slow?
3.	What new beginnings do you feel called to step into?
