## Healing Together: A 21-Day Family Bible Study on Coping with Miscarriage



Journey through grief as a family, finding God's comfort and hope in His Word while healing from miscarriage together.





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#### Introduction

Experiencing miscarriage can be one of the most heart-wrenching trials a family faces. It brings a profound sense of loss that touches every member in unique ways, often leaving hearts heavy with grief, confusion, and unanswered questions. Grieving as a family is not about rushing to feel better but about acknowledging pain, leaning on God and each other, and gradually finding peace. This study will help you process emotions and discover that even in loss, God's grace abounds. Let His Word be your anchor as you honor your child's memory and move forward, guided by His faithful love.







May this journey bring you moments of solace, understanding, and renewed hope as you open your hearts to God's healing presence and cherish the precious gift of family.

#### Devotional: God Draws Near to the Brokenhearted
