We will examine God's perspective on love, honesty, boundaries, forgiveness, and renewal. You will be encouraged to identify unhealthy patterns and hold firmly to God's promises.

Remember, you don't walk this journey alone. The Holy Spirit walks beside you to bring clarity, courage, and healing. As you engage daily, may your faith be strengthened and your marriage renewed, anchored in God's unwavering







truth and love. Let this devotional time be a step toward freedom and wholeness.

Devotional: Protecting Your Heart Amid Emotional Manipulation

Emotional manipulation often preys on the vulnerabilities of the heart, twisting feelings to control and confuse. Proverbs 4:23 reminds us to *guard our hearts* diligently because our heart is the wellspring of life, affecting every thought, word, and action.

Healthy boundaries are not walls to shut others out, but protections that honour God's design for respect and honesty. Matthew 5:37 encourages clear and simple communication — allowing yes to mean yes and no to mean no — which stands firm against the manipulative tactics that seek to blur boundaries.

2 Corinthians 10:5 reveals the spiritual battle involved. We are called to take captive every thought and idea that opposes God's truth. This includes rejecting manipulation disguised as love or concern. Guarding your heart means allowing God's truth to sculpt what you accept as reality, rather than defaulting to feelings or words that create confusion or guilt.

Today, invite God to help you recognize emotional manipulation and provide the wisdom and courage to set healthy boundaries that honor Him and protect your marriage.
