Each day offers relevant Scripture, supporting verses, and guided reflections to help you connect deeply with God's heart and renew your hope. There are journaling prompts to capture your thoughts and a prayer to encourage you as you face OSA challenges. May this study serve as a balm to your soul and a beacon of light on your path toward health and spiritual renewal.















Your Verse

Matthew 11:28 - "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 4:8 "In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, Lord, make me dwell in safety."
- Isaiah 40:31 "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."







Devotional: Resting Spiritually When Sleep Is Broken

Obstructive sleep apnea often robs us of physical rest, making nights feel endless and exhausting. Yet Jesus invites us into a different kind of rest—a soul-refreshing rest that transcends our circumstances. **Matthew 11:28** calls out to everyone who feels burdened, promising rest that only He can give.

This rest is not just about physical sleep, but a deep spiritual peace that guards our hearts even in restless nights. When your body struggles to find quiet, your spirit can still find refuge in God's presence. *He can carry your heavy burdens and renew your strength*.

Psalm 4:8 reminds us that true safety and peace are found in God alone. Even when sleep escapes you, God's care surrounds you. Isaiah assures we can hope in the Lord, and this hope replenishes strength beyond what sleep alone can provide.

Today, focus on inviting Jesus into your fatigue and allow Him to refresh your soul amid whatever physical challenges you endure.

Prayer for Today

Your Verse

Isaiah 40:29 - "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Devotional: God's Strength When Your Body Feels Weak

Living with OSA can leave you feeling physically weak and drained. Yet, Scripture reassures us that God's strength becomes most visible in our weakness. **Isaiah 40:29** promises that God provides strength to those who feel weary and powerless.

Our physical limitations do not limit God's ability to empower us. In fact, the Apostle Paul reminds us through *2 Corinthians 12:9* that God's grace is sufficient and His power is made perfect when we recognize our own fragility. This means that your weakness is an opportunity to experience the fullness of God's strength.

Psalm 73:26 beautifully captures the tension between human frailty and divine strength. Even when your body fails due to ongoing health struggles like OSA, God remains the strength of your heart—a reliable portion forever.

As you wait for better sleep and healing, remember that God uses this time to renew and empower your spirit far beyond what your body can do alone.

Philippians 4:6-7 – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Supporting Scriptures

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you."
- Psalm 34:4 "I sought the Lord, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears."







Devotional: Experiencing God's Peace Over Anxiety

It's common to feel anxiety when struggling with obstructive sleep apnea—worries about health, rest, and daily functioning can flood your mind. Yet, God's Word invites you to replace anxiety with prayer and thanksgiving. **Philippians 4:6-7** tells us to bring every concern to God, promising a peace that surpasses human understanding.

Peace from God is not passive or fragile; it acts as a protector over your heart and mind when anxiety threatens to overwhelm. Jesus Himself offers this peace in *John 14:27*, assuring us that it is a gift from Him, distinct from what the world gives.

Psalm 34:4 recounts how God delivers us from fear when we seek Him. If anxiety creeps in with your OSA struggles, you are encouraged to cry out to God and trust in His loving care—letting His peace transform your thoughts.

Today, practice turning worries into prayers. Cultivate a heart of thanksgiving, and rest in God's promise to protect your spirit with His profound peace.

Devotional: Overflowing with Hope Through the Spirit

Devotional: Honoring God by Nurturing Your Health

Devotional: Embracing God's Faithfulness Each Morning

Chronic conditions like obstructive sleep apnea can steal the joy of waking up refreshed. But each new morning offers an opportunity to embrace God's compassion and faithfulness afresh. **Lamentations 3:22–23** beautifully reminds us that God's mercies are new every morning.

Beginning your day with God, as Psalm 5:3 encourages, sets a tone of hope and dependence. Morning prayer and surrender invite God's strength to fill every waking moment, even when the night was restless.

Exodus promises that worshiping God invites His healing presence, which includes physical restoration and peace. While healing is a process, starting your day grounded in God's love gives spiritual strength to face whatever comes.
