Devotional: Making God's Word the Heartbeat of Family Life

Devotional: Welcoming Children's Questions as a Pathway to Faith

Devotional: Living Out a Passion for God's Word

Children learn much more from what we do than what we say. Psalm 1:2 shows the blessed person is one who delights deeply in God's law, meditating on it continually. When children see parents valuing Scripture, it ignites their own desire to know God's Word.

Joshua 1:8 exhorts us to keep God's law on our lips and meditate on it day and night. This ongoing engagement with Scripture forms the foundation for faith. 1 Corinthians 11:1 challenges believers to model Christlike living for others to follow.

To help children love the Bible, let us reflect on our own habits. Do we read Scripture regularly? Do we express joy and reliance on God's Word? When children observe our enthusiasm and obedience, they learn that the Bible is relevant and life-changing.

Seek to live intentionally, shining the light of God's Word in your home so children eagerly embrace it as their treasure.
