- Proverbs 20:7 "The righteous lead blameless lives; blessed are their children after them."







Day 1: A The Heart of a Godly Father

Devotional: Reflecting God's Compassion Through Fathers

Father's Day is a reminder of God's compassion! Psalm 103:13 paints a beautiful picture of a father's compassion mirroring that of God Himself. Fathers are called not only to discipline but also to love with patience and understanding. Godly fathers reflect the tenderness of God as they guide, protect, and nurture their children.

In Ephesians 6:4, we are reminded that fathers are not to provoke their children but to nurture them with godly teaching. This nurturance involves more than rules—it involves modelled character, sincere love, and patience. When fathers live righteously and lead blamelessly, their children are a blessing (Proverbs 20:7). Father's Day provides a chance to appreciate those who embody this heart of compassion and to pray for those still growing in their role.

Today, think about the fathers you know who have demonstrated this godly compassion and consider how their faith has impacted you or others around them. May we honor God's heart by celebrating fathers who mirror it well.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Corinthians 11:3 "The head of every man is Christ, the head of a wife is her husband, and the head of Christ is God."







Day 2: V Leading with Godly Wisdom

Devotional: The Father's Role in Spiritual Leadership

Godly fathers lead with wisdom and intentionality. Proverbs 4 emphasizes the importance of listening to a father's teaching, which is often rooted in godly wisdom passed down from generation to generation. Fathers hold the sacred responsibility to train their families in the ways of the Lord, setting examples of faith and obedience.

Joshua's declaration that he and his household will serve the Lord illustrates how leadership in a family sets a spiritual tone. Fathers who commit to serving God first naturally lead their families in faith.

Paul's words in 1 Corinthians remind us that the father's leadership role is modeled after Christ's relationship with the Church—marked by love, responsibility, and humility. True leadership echoes Christ's example, not authoritarian power. On this Father's Day, reflect on how fathers in your life demonstrate godly wisdom and leadership, and how you can support and honor those leaders.

Colossians 3:21 "Fathers, do not embitter your children, or they will become discouraged."

Supporting Scriptures

- Deuteronomy 6:6-7 "These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children."
- Psalm 127:3 "Children are a heritage from the LORD, offspring a reward from him."







Devotional: Balancing Discipline with Encouragement

Guide with patience, integrity, and love. Colossians 3:21 warns fathers not to provoke their children to discouragement, emphasizing the importance of balanced guidance. A father's role is not to rule with harshness but to uplift and nurture in a way that fosters growth and confidence.

Deuteronomy reminds fathers to impress God's commandments deeply in the hearts of their children, making faith an integral part of family life. This spiritual education is a precious inheritance—children are a reward from God (Psalm 127:3).

On this third day of our study, reflect on how fathers can marry strength with tenderness. How can they nurture integrity while showing love that encourages and builds up? Father's Day honors those who faithfully guide their children in truth and grace.

1.	Write about a time you felt encouraged or discouraged by a father figure.

3.	Reflect on how you can show integrity in relationships with family.







Prayer for Today

Heavenly Father, help fathers to lead without harshness but with patience and love. Teach them to nurture their children in ways that build confidence and faith. May they treasure their children as blessings and guide them in Your truth. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Ephesians 5:25 "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Timothy 5:8 "Anyone who does not provide for their relatives ... has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever."
- Micah 6:8 "What does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."







Devotional: Sacrificial Love: The Father's Strength

The strength of a godly father is shown in sacrificial love. Ephesians 5:25 calls husbands—and by extension fathers—to love sacrificially, as Christ loved the church. This love is active, self-giving, and puts the needs of the family first.

Providing for and protecting the family is a serious responsibility, highlighted in 1 Timothy 5:8. This provision is not only about finances but also emotional and spiritual support. Father's Day honors men who serve their families faithfully through sacrifice and strength.

Micah 6:8 reminds us that walking humbly with God involves acting justly and loving mercy—qualities central to the godly father's character. Today, consider the ways sacrificial service builds strong families and invites God's blessing.
