Devotional: God's Nearness to the Brokenhearted

Devotional: Honoring Grief as Part of Healing

Grief takes many forms, and it's perfectly natural to feel sorrow in the aftermath of tragedy. Ecclesiastes reminds us that life has seasons, including seasons of mourning. Accepting your sorrow fully is an essential step in healing—not something to fight or ignore.

Jesus Himself embodied this truth. The shortest verse in the Bible, "Jesus wept," shows us that grief is human and even deeply felt by God. He understands the pain caused by loss because He experienced it.

Moreover, 2 Corinthians 1:3–4 reveals that God is the ultimate source of comfort. As you weep, know that God's comfort is reaching out to you and all in your community, encouraging a movement from sorrow toward healing over time.

Give yourself permission to mourn authentically while trusting God's timing for renewal.
