#### Your Verse

Matthew 21:8–9 NIV "A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

#### Supporting Scriptures

- Mark 11:9 "Those who went in front and those who followed shouted, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!'"
- John 12:13 "They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the king of Israel!""







#### Devotional: Embracing Jesus as King with Expectant Hope

**The Triumphal Entry** reveals the joyous proclamation of Jesus as King by a multitude welcoming Him into Jerusalem. The crowd's waving of palm branches and loud cries of *"Hosanna!"* expressed hope for salvation and the fulfillment of God's promises.

These crowds recognized Jesus as the promised Messiah, yet many did not understand the path He would take—one of suffering and ultimate victory through the cross. Their celebration mixed expectation with incomplete understanding, a testament to how God's timing and purposes often unfold in ways beyond human anticipation.

As we reflect on this moment, we are invited to consider our own response to Jesus. Are we proclaiming Him as King in our daily lives? Do we embrace both the joy of His salvation and the humility found in following Him faithfully?

#### Devotional: Hosanna: A Prayer for Salvation and Hope

**Hosanna** is more than a cheer; it is a prayer, a plea for salvation meaning "Save, please!" or "Save now!" It reflects the deep yearning of God's people for deliverance.

When the crowds shouted "Hosanna to the Son of David," they acknowledged Jesus' royal lineage and asked Him to bring salvation. This word ties back to Psalm 118, a song of victory and trust in God's saving power. It calls us to recognize Jesus as the fulfillment of these ancient hopes.

Today, the cry "Hosanna" challenges us to renew our dependence on God to save and redeem us in every circumstance. It invites us to call out to Him when we feel in need and to celebrate His ability to bring triumph where we see trials.

#### Devotional: Living Authentic Worship Every Day

**Palm Sunday's worship** was both expressive and communal—a public declaration of Jesus as King. Yet *worship* goes beyond outward actions; it involves the heart and spirit.

Jesus teaches us that true worship is in spirit and in truth. It requires sincerity and a heart aligned with God's will. Our worship is not about the spectacle but about a genuine connection with the Father through Jesus.

As we wave our palms and sing "Hosanna," let us remember that authentic worship continues every day as we live for God's glory. It's an invitation to live fully surrendered, praising God both in joyous celebration and in quiet obedience.

Mark 10:45 NIV "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Philippians 2:5-8 "He made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness."
- John 13:14–15 "Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet."







#### Devotional: Following Christ's Example of Servant Leadership

Though hailed as King on Palm Sunday, Jesus' kingship was unique—marked by humility and service rather than earthly power. He demonstrated that true leadership involves sacrifice.

Jesus came not just to be praised but to serve and ultimately give His life to redeem us. This contrast between the crowd's celebratory shouts and His servant heart reveals God's kingdom values.

As followers of Christ, we are called to emulate His servant leadership. The holiday reminds us to balance joyful worship with willing service, living out faith through love and humility.

#### Your Verse

Luke 24:6-7 NIV "He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 1 Corinthians 15:20 "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep."
- Romans 6:9 "For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him."







#### Devotional: Living in the Hope of the Resurrection

The waving palms and shouts of 'Hosanna' on Palm Sunday point forward to the hope found beyond the cross—the resurrection.

Though the journey led Jesus through suffering and death, His resurrection assures us of ultimate victory over sin and death. This hope transforms holidays like Palm Sunday from mere tradition into a living celebration of God's redeeming power.

Reflecting on the risen King encourages us to live with confidence and peace, knowing that God's promises are sure and His love eternal.
