Your Verse

John 15:13 – "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 2:5-8 "Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus...he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death."







Day 15: 1 Hospitality Rooted in Christ's Sacrifice

Devotional: Sacrificial Love Enables Deep Hospitality

True hospitality is deeply rooted in the sacrificial love of Christ. John 15:13 points to the ultimate expression of love—laying down one's life. Though hospitality usually doesn't require literal sacrifice of life, it does call for personal cost: time, energy, comfort, and resources.

Romans 5:10 and Philippians 2 remind us of Christ's humility and obedience, a model for servant-hearted hospitality. By following His example, families learn to welcome others with self-emptying love that prioritizes others' needs above their own.

Reflect today on what sacrifices your family might embrace to practice radical hospitality.

Day 16: A Hospitality Reflecting God's Kingdom Values

Devotional: Living Kingdom Hospitality with Justice and Mercy

Christian hospitality reflects the values of God's Kingdom, especially inclusion and justice. Jesus in Luke 14 challenges us to invite those who cannot repay us, turning worldly expectations upside down.

James 2 warns against favoritism, reminding us that God honors impartial hospitality. Serving "the least of these" (Matthew 25:40) brings us into the heart of Kingdom ministry, where mercy and justice prevail.

Consider how your home ministry can embody these Kingdom values by welcoming marginalized and overlooked people first.

Luke 6:38 promises abundant return on our giving, and Acts 20:35 highlights the greater blessing found in giving than receiving. The Christian home that practices hospitality experiences mutual growth and joy, deepening faith and relationship.

Devotional: Teaching Faith through Hospitality at Home

Deuteronomy 6:6-7 highlights the importance of daily conversations about God's commands. Hospitality creates natural rhythms for teaching and sharing Jesus' love during shared meals and fellowship.

Ephesians 6:4 stresses the responsibility to train children in the Lord's ways, and Psalm 78 reminds us to pass along stories of God's faithfulness. When families extend hospitality, they live out and share their faith, impacting all generations.
