Joshua 1:9 - "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."

#### Devotional: Trusting God Builds Unshakable Courage

**Starting with the powerful reminder in Joshua 1:9,** God commands courage and assures His unending presence. As parents, we can encourage our children to root their confidence not in their own strength but in the faithfulness of God.

Trust is the foundation of courage. It is often fear of the unknown or of failure that holds us and our children back. Teaching children to rely on God when they feel afraid transforms fear into boldness. Psalm 56:3 reminds us that even when fear arises, placing trust in God offers a shield of peace.

Encourage your child today to say this verse aloud whenever fear feels overwhelming: "I will trust God and be brave." Today's focus is a call for parents to model and verbalize trust in God to empower our children with courage.

#### Devotional: Empowered by God's Spirit to Overcome Fear

**Fear often breeds timidity and hesitation,** but God gifts us with a Spirit of power and love that empowers courageous living. 2 Timothy 1:7 reminds us that fear is not from God, but His Spirit strengthens us with boldness.

As parents, teaching children to recognize when fear tries to control them helps build spiritual resilience. Encouraging kids to call on God's Spirit can transform anxious moments. Psalm 27:1 is a powerful declaration for children to memorize and speak when fear strikes: "Whom shall I fear?" It points them to God as their ultimate protector.

**Trusting God over their own understanding is a vital lesson.** Proverbs 3:5–6 instructs us to lean on His guidance, not our limited perspective. Teaching our children this truth equips them to navigate fears with faith rather than uncertainty.

Philippians 4:6-7 – "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives."
- Psalm 34:4 "I sought the LORD, and he answered me; he delivered me from all my fears."







## Devotional: Prayer and Peace Protect Courageous Hearts

**Fear often manifests as anxiety and worry,** but Paul encourages us to replace anxiety with prayer and thanksgiving. Philippians 4:6–7 reveals how prayer invites God's peace to guard our hearts and minds, acting as a strong defense against fear.

Teaching children to pray about their fears and to be thankful even in difficult times trains their hearts to trust God's peace instead of succumbing to anxiety. This is a lifelong skill that strengthens their inner courage.

Jesus promised in John 14:27 a peace unlike anything the world can offer. Helping children understand and receive this peace brings calm in fearful situations. Psalm 34:4 gives a testimony of God's deliverance from fear, a reminder that God hears and rescues us when we turn to Him.

Describe what God's peace means to you and your family.

#### Your Verse

## Devotional: Discipline Cultivates Courageous Character

**Instilling courage is not just about encouraging boldness**, but also about guiding children with godly discipline that shapes character. Proverbs 22:6 emphasizes the importance of early training that sets a foundation for lifelong courage and faithfulness.

#### Devotional: God's Perfect Love Drives Out Fear

**Perfect love casts out fear.** As parents, reminding our children of God's perfect, unfailing love is a powerful weapon against fear. 1 John 4:18 teaches that fear comes from a place of punishment or uncertainty, but God's love assures us of safety and acceptance.

*Knowing that nothing can separate us from God's love* (Romans 8:38–39) gives courage to face trials without fear. This confidence instills a deep sense of peace and strength in children, reassuring them no matter what they face.

Zephaniah 3:17 pictures God as a Mighty Warrior who delights in saving His people, highlighting that divine love is not passive but fiercely protective. Teaching our children that God's love fights for them builds resilience and fearless hearts.

#### Devotional: Faith in Action Builds Lasting Courage

Courage is more than a feeling— it is faith demonstrated through action. James 2:26 reminds us that genuine faith shows itself in deeds. Parents can create opportunities for children to act with faith, helping courage grow stronger with experience.

Faith grows as children take small steps of trust and see God's faithfulness in response. Hebrews 11:1 gives us the foundation of faith — hope and assurance even when outcomes are unseen.

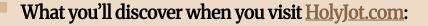




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
