Your Verse

Joel 2:28 – "And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions."

Supporting Scriptures

- Daniel 2:22 "He reveals deep and hidden things; he knows what lies in darkness, and light dwells with him."
- Acts 2:17 "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams."







Devotional: God's Use of Dreams as Divine Communication

Dreams have been a significant way God communicates with His people throughout biblical history. From Joseph interpreting Pharaoh's dreams (Genesis 41) to Daniel perceiving visions of the future, God often uses dreams to reveal His plans. Joel 2:28 reminds us that dreams will be part of the Spirit's outpouring in the last days, underscoring their importance. However, dreams can be both divine and natural, requiring discernment.

Today's focus is to ground our understanding that not every dream is a prophecy. Some dreams come from subconscious thoughts or emotions, while others carry spiritual insight. *God wants us to seek Him and His Word first to interpret these dreams correctly.* Trust Scripture as the ultimate authority over feelings or fears.

As you begin this study, ask the Holy Spirit to help you discern the origin and meaning of your dreams. Remember that understanding comes through God's revelation, not guesswork or anxiety.

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword..."
- Psalm 119:105 "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."







Devotional: Scripture as the Final Interpretation Standard

When interpreting End Times dreams, the Bible is the foundational lens. 2 Timothy 3:16–17 emphasizes that Scripture is inspired by God and equips us completely. This assurance means no interpretation of a dream should contradict Scripture.

Too often, emotions or fears can cloud our understanding, leading to false interpretations or even anxiety. However, the Word of God is living and powerful (Hebrews 4:12). It provides clarity and direction, acting as a light to our path (Psalm 119:105).

As you pray about your dreams, continually ask if your understanding aligns with God's revealed truth. If a dream's interpretation contradicts Scripture, it should be discarded or reconsidered. Trust God's Word above feelings or speculative ideas.

Your Verse

1 Thessalonians 5:20–21 – "Do not treat prophecies with contempt but test them all; hold on to what is good."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 John 4:1 "Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God..."
- Deuteronomy 18:22 "When a prophet speaks in the name of the LORD, if the thing does not happen or come true, that is a message the LORD has not spoken."







Devotional: Wise Testing of Dreams and Prophecies

God commands His people to test prophetic words, including dreams and visions. 1 Thessalonians 5:20–21 encourages believers to not reject prophecies outright but to examine them carefully and retain what is good. This safeguard helps prevent deception and emotional confusion.

1 John 4:1 warns to test the spirits behind messages, discerning their divine origin. Dreams related to End Times themes can be powerful but must be weighed against Scripture and observed for fruitfulness.

Deuteronomy 18:22 provides a practical test — prophecy that fails to come true is not from God. Interpreting dreams demands patience, careful prayer, and Scriptural alignment. Don't rush to conclusions; seek the Spirit's guidance and wisdom.

Prayer for Today

Teach me to hold what is good and reject anything that does not align with Your truth. Surround me with Your Spirit of truth so I may hear Your voice clearly. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

John 16:13 – "But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 8:14 "For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God."
- James 1:5 "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."







Devotional: Guidance of the Spirit in Dream Interpretation

The Holy Spirit is essential for interpreting dreams and discerning God's will. Jesus promised in John 16:13 that the Spirit of truth will guide us into all truth, illuminating our understanding beyond intellectual effort alone.

Romans 8:14 reminds us that being led by the Spirit identifies us as God's children. This intimate relationship means we have access to divine wisdom and insight.

When faced with confusing or fearful End Times dreams, James 1:5 encourages us to ask God for wisdom generously. It is important to seek the Spirit's promptings daily to clarify the meanings and reduce anxiety.

Invite the Holy Spirit into your dream interpretations. Trust that He will speak peace and clarity as you surrender your feelings and lean on His guidance.

Day 5: 🔼 Interpreting Symbols Biblically

Devotional: Biblical Foundation for Dream Symbols

Many End Times dreams contain symbolic images that require biblical interpretation. The book of Revelation itself is full of vivid symbols given by God to communicate spiritual truths about the future.

Understanding these symbols requires careful study of Scripture to avoid wrong conclusions or sensationalism. For instance, Daniel's vision of the 'Son of Man' (Daniel 7:13–14) points to Christ's ultimate authority, offering hope.

Likewise, Ezekiel's vision of dry bones (Ezekiel 37) symbolizes Israel's restoration and God's power to give life. Such symbols serve to inspire faith and readiness, not fear.

When you notice symbols in your dreams, turn to the Bible for meaning and context. Connect your dream content to Scripture to receive balanced, Godhonoring interpretations.

Day 6: Guarding Against Fear and Deception

Your Verse

2 Timothy 1:7 - "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- Matthew 24:24 "For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and perform great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect."







Day 6: Guarding Against Fear and Deception

Devotional: Overcoming Fear with God's Spirit

End Times dreams can sometimes provoke fear or anxiety, but God's Spirit gives us power and love instead. 2 Timothy 1:7 assures us that fear does not come from God. When interpreting dreams, guarding against fear-driven responses is vital.

Isaiah 41:10 comforts us with God's presence, reminding us that we are not alone in unsettling times. Fear can cloud judgment and open doors to deception, as Matthew 24:24 warns concerning false prophets and signs.

Being aware of these dangers helps you maintain focus on God's truth rather than sensationalism. Pray for self-discipline to reject fear and deception and stand firm in faith.

Ultimately, interpreting End Times dreams should lead us to live with hope and readiness. Titus 2:13 calls us to anticipate the glorious return of Jesus Christ, our blessed hope.

1 Peter 1:13 urges preparation and self-control while we wait. This study is not about generating fear but fostering spiritual alertness—watchfulness as encouraged in Matthew 25:13.

Your dreams and the insights you gain should inspire faith-filled action, prayer, and readiness for Christ's return. Trust God's timing and hold onto hope, knowing He is in control.
